"Before I formed you in thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations." Jer 1:5.

This scripture was read over the pastor and his wife as well as I Tim 1:4 – "Neither give heed to fables and endless genealogies, which minister questions, rather than godly edifying which is in faith: so do.

This is when the Calvary Missionary Baptist Church Praise Team began their incredible praise and worship music in the midst of about 160 people with Give Myself Away. Then the most amazing thing happened: in midsong the Calvary Missionary Baptist Choir stood up in the middle of the congregation and joined the praise team. They then went into My Life is Not my Own. The music was the sort that one's spirit can float away on — the kind that ushers one into the presence of the Lord.

Brother Jeff Wilson reminded us all of John 20:20, after which the offering was accepted and the Next Level Praise Team began, "May the glory of the Lord rise among us." This was followed by the Calvary Missionary Baptist Praise Team. When they sang, "No more shackles, no more chains, I am free," It brought this reporter to tears

NEXT LEVEL MINISTRIES has an incredible mime team: The Silent Truth. They did a moving silent portrayal of the song, He'll never put more on me than I can bear.

Pastor Derek Mayweather brought the word. "Folks are always talking about how they walk with Jesus. In a real walk with Jesus your mouth will be closed. People have become

comfortable in the church. That is why some don't even participate. They wouldn't raise their arms if their armpits were burning.

"When you are in the body of Christ sometimes people "hear from God." The problem is that their lives do not show it. God does not waste words. What he says must be manifest. If you heard from him, it must manifest itself, or you did not hear from him. Why is it, if so many people have "heard form God," is there so much conflicting information? There are people who act as if the Holy Spirit only speaks to them.

"You have to know his times. You have to shift when God shifts. You have to be agile and ready to shift. You must be flexible. If you are fixed in a traditional mind set you cannot shift when he shifts. You cannot know his times.

"Don't think you're somebody because you have a title. Lose that title. Become an empty vessel. Stop being Pastor So-and-so, or Bishop So-and-so, or Apostle So-and-so, or Minister So-and-so. You don't need a title. When you see the Lord face to face in the kingdom, he's not going to pay any attention to your title. You'll just be plain So-and-so. When the shift is on, you'll have to take off all arrogance and pride and titles.

"If you want to go to the next level, then when everybody else is going up, you're gonna have to go down. The most powerful position is at his feet." Pastor Mayweather, still in John chapter 13, reminded us of verse 4: (Jesus) "rose from supper, and laying aside his garments; and taking a towel, he girded himself about."

"Never let your title be bigger than your towel. Never stop being a servant."

Pastor Mayweather told everyone to stand and shift all the way to the other side of the church. "Tell somebody. Say, 'Shift!'" After having everyone in the church shift three times, he closed his sermon with a very emotionally charged and extremely energetic closing. As the played, the pastor and congregation sang, "Holy ground, For 18 minutes. participation was incredible. People danced for the Lord, Praised him loudly, fell on their knees and on their faces.

Bishop Melvin Lambert of Overcoming Church of Fayetteville, North Carolina actually performed the Ceremony of Installation. All-in-all, it was a very spirit-filled way to spend a Sunday evening.

"I grew up around the ministry." Pastor Cleveland told Battlefield News. "I've been involved in the things of the Lord all my life. At the age of seven I gave my life to Christ and began to minister at the age of 12. I became a youth pastor under my grandmother, Apostle Doris Lewis of Move of God Church."

Pastor Cleveland expounded on the need for reaching out to the youth and how they are the future. "Young people are out in the street looking for something different. We can show it to them."

Pastor Cleveland was ordained in 1998 at Move of God and is presently working on a theology degree at Grand Canyon University.

NEXT LEVEL MINISTRIES is in a free-standing building. "There is a group of guys in Barrow County called the Brotherhood Club," the pastor told BFN, "They only use the building twice a month. So, they allowed us to rent it and we opened the church in November."

"The worship experience is probably like no other in the county." Said Pastor Cleveland.

A youth conference is planned for April and Basketball tournaments for May. There is a mime ministry – The Silent Truth, and a whole lot of music ministry. Those at Next Level are putting together men's, women's and children's ministries.

There are about 30 warriors at the church and church leaders include Worship Leader Denzell Phillips and Minister of Music Jeffrey Wilson.

Service times are Sunday at 1000 and Bible study at 1900 (7pm) on Wednesday evening beginning some time in March.

When he teaches and preaches his excitement causes an excitement in those present such that the zeal for the Lord that he displays is always seen in those in his congregation.

"If God be for us, who can be against us? We are unstoppable by the power of Jesus Christ."

Every man and the few women that were present could be seen in front of the altar with hands raised, praising God with fervor.

The Reverend Anthony Smith, pastor of O'Kelley Chapel Baptist Church in Loganville preached on that Wednesday.

Pastor Harris first thanked God for Pastor Smith and then thanked Pastor Smith for "preaching his heart out."

"I used to drag race in the street years ago." Shared Pastor Harris. "I was out of control. Most men are out of control. If you can't serve God, you are out of control. For me, it was women. Then, in 1972 I messed up and married a saved woman. I was realizing that God was real. Then in 1982 she died. I went backward and began running with 12 different women. God took every one of them and every one else away from me so he could deal with me."

Christ Outreach Worship Center began 7 September 2008. I met Jesus on the cross," shared Pastor Harris, "in September of 1985 at three o'clock in the afternoon and I fell down and cried out to him and all guilt and pain was gone from me. I was free. I cried out, 'Lord, here am I. Send me."

The church is planning a women's revival on a date and time to be announced. Pastor Harris is also planning soon to begin taking the word of God into people's homes.

"We must be ever mindful," says Pastor Willie Harris, "of Proverbs 16:20 – 'He that handleth a matter wisely should find good: and whoso trusteth in the Lord, happy is he.' The enemy came against me and my wife and she could turn no women around because of it. Trust in God. We are still working."

Pastor Harris told BFN that Christ Outreach has about ten mighty prayer warriors, including James Jordan, and a deacon – Phillip Wells, an evangelist.

Service times are as follows: Sunday School at 0930, worship at 1100, evening praise and worship is at 1830

(6pm) and Wednesday Bible study is at 1900 (7pm).

"And I had almost bitten my tongue off." Continued Pastor Adair. "I was taken out of there by an ambulance." It took a year to heal from those wounds but while the healing was taking place, a man called and wanted to donate the church.

The mayor of Winder introduced Pastor Adair to the fire chief, who recommended he not use the church building. A structural engineer, however, thought it would work fine. The 104-year-old church was donated to SANCTUARY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT by Winder's Dr. C. B. Skelton in 2006. The church, originally built in 1904, was a Methodist/Episcopal Church.

The Service began with the music of the Sanctuary of the Holy Spirit Praise Team led by Andrea Corbello, Minister of Music. The music accomplished exactly what praise and worship music is supposed to accomplish. It helped us all to be in touch with the Holy Spirit. It was very effective and exceptional. It is apparently the practice of this congregation to remain standing for the entire time of praise and worship. This reporter was in tears - the tears that come from being in the presence of the Living God - for the entire time of praise and worship.

"When we invoke his name," Pastor Adair began addressing the congregation of about 40 people, "things happen. We don't realize how close this life and the next really are." He spoke about his son, Sean, who was in intensive care at the time. He shared that Sean saw a man in the doorway of his hospital room praying. He recognized a family friend who had passed on some years earlier.

"We need a spiritual understanding," explained the pastor, "of earthly relationships. Jesus compares his relationship with the church to the relationship of a husband and wife.

"In the beginning, Adam's job was threefold with respect to the earth: Fill it, subdue it and take dominion over it. He failed in maturity."

"...The weapons of our warfare are not carnal..." (II Cor 10:4).

"Because of Adam we lost the ability to speak words from God like this – to speak things into existence. Jesus restored this.

Galatians 4:21 – "Tell me, ye that desire to be under the law, do ye not hear the law?"

"Paul is using an allegory to illustrate the futility of attempting to be saved by keeping the law. Verses 21 through 31 are this. In verse 25 the Jerusalem he speaks of is the physical Jerusalem but in verse 26 he speaks of the 'Jerusalem above' in other words the *New Jerusalem* of Revelation 21:2. The Jerusalem above is the mother of us all because it is the bride.

"The earth was divided by God into 71 divisions and God himself took Jacob (Israel) as his portion. (see Deut 32). Remember, the name 'Abraham' means father of many nations.

"There is no more temple in Jerusalem. It was destroyed in 70 A.D. Since the cross, we are the temple.

"In Rev 21:9, the New Jerusalem is described as the wife of the lamb. In verse 10 John is carried away 'in the spirit' to see the New Jerusalem.

"In Colossians 1:15 Paul describes Jesus as 'the image of the invisible God.' This is the Theophany – the Shekinah – the **visible** manifestation of the presence of God.

"Jesus said in John 6:63, 'the words that I speak unto you, they are **spirit** and they are life.'

"Romans 10:17 says, 'Faith comes by hearing.' It is the present tense. It does not say, 'faith comes by "having heard" Faith is like manna. You cannot keep it or it will spoil. You must gather it every day.

"According to Ephesians 1:20-22 and Eph 3:10-12, we are to make known the manifold wisdom of God to whom? To the principalities and powers in the heavenly places. Our words have much more power than we

realize. It was words that established everything and that is still the way it is now. The **name** of Jesus is powerful." Pastor Phillip Adair was married to his wife, Linda in 1968 and began at Lee University in Cleveland, Tn. At the age of 20. He has pastored in Florida, Alabama and Pennsylvania, and has evangelized in Virginia, Alabama, and Tennessee. He moved to Georgia in 1984. He lost a son and was unsure whether he would continue but he has. He began in Georgia with a garage Bible study and went on to rent a church in Loganville. He started with the present body of believers in 2005 in a building owned by the Daughters of the American Revolution and was in the present church by July of 2006. The restoration of the church was complete by April of 2007. There is much more information including the amazing before-and-after pictures on the church website at shswinder .org. The church is planning a BBQ at a time and date to be announced. The service times are as follows: Sunday at 1000 and a men's Thursday evening prayer meeting at 1930 (7pm). A women's meeting is presently in the early stages on Tuesday morning headed by Ann Arnold.

This company-sized unit is comprised of about 100 believers and plans are being made to use the church building seven days a week. One example is a successful living seminar for young couples to learn about finances, cooking, checkbook balancing and spiritual things.

## Revival at Sanctuary of Pentecost

The praise and worship was so intense and spirit-filled that this reporter soared under the wings of the Almighty with tears streaming. The praise team sang *Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, I am a friend of God,* and *Holiness.* They sang other wonderful songs as well.

There appeared to be about eighty people present at the revival as Pastor Etheridge stood up behind the pulpit. "Sometimes we know, and we don't need to hear any more about it from God. All that to say, 'I just want to be real with God.' He is big enough to reach past our religion and reach our heart."

One young brother in the church, John Bottley III, gave a testimony: "I don't have a statue and I don't have to travel half way around the world to make a pilgrimage to some holy city, but I have a name, and that name is JESUS!"

As the music continued, 18 people came to the front to be anointed.

"We all want a miracle," said the pastor, "but we don't want to **be** the miracle."

The praise team played *I Just Can't Stop Praising His Name* as the offering was accepted. The atmosphere was filled with excitement, very energetic.

"We praise," explained the pastor, "until it becomes worship, and then he will hear it. When I need healing, I do this until I am healed." The pastor introduced the speaker, Pastor Robert Davis of Truth Tabernacle in Wheelersville, Ohio.

"The president of a major Christian University told his professors, 'always be kind to you're A and B students. They may return and be excellent professors. Always be kind to your C students. They are the ones to return and build you a multimillion-dollar building.'

"An atheist went to the ACLU to complain that there were no holidays for atheists. 'The Christians have Christmas and Easter, the Jews have Hanukah, the Muslims have Ramadan and the atheists have no holiday. The ACLU took it to court and the judge threw it out of court. The judge shared that, based on Psalm 53:1 ("The fool says in his heart, 'There is no God") Atheists did have a holiday – April 1<sup>st</sup>."

"You need the baptism of the Holy Spirit. God wants you to have it but he's not going to force it on you. John 14:12 says, "...he who believes in me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do..." In Acts chapter two we see that it was prayer that set off the day of Pentecost. When the Jews asked Peter, 'What can we do to get this blood off our hands?' He answered in Acts 2:38, '...Repent, and let each of you be

baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.' The check has already been made out to **you** and you **can** receive it. God wants you to have it. Ask him for the baptism in the Holy Spirit."

The speaker, Pastor Davis, reminded us of Jesus' words in Acts 1:8. "...You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you..."

He also reminded us of the story in Acts chapter 19 where some disciples in Ephesus that had been baptized had not even heard of the Holy Spirit. Paul baptized them again in the name of Jesus and they received the Holy Spirit when Paul laid hands on them.

"Don't let any preacher tell you that just because you got saved, you received the Holy Ghost. Revelation 3:20 says, 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him, and will dine with him, and he with me.' You can answer the door or ignore the knock and keep living like you're living. The Lord is creating even as we speak and remember, you are the canyas."

# Love Your Neighbor as Yourself continued

Here I am again. I left off last month saying that we **should** hate bad things but that we are to hate those bad behaviors in others the same way we hate them in ourselves: being sorry that they have done such things, and hoping that they may be healed of such behavior.

I said that there is a test that we can run on ourselves to see how we are faring in this. Here it is.

Suppose we hear a story on the news about some filthy, horrible atrocities that happened. Then, we find out that the story was not completely true or that these things were not quite as bad as originally reported. Is our first feeling, "Thank God. Even **they** aren't quite that bad." Or do we have a feeling of disappointment or even want to cling to the original story for the pleasure of believing that our enemies **are** as bad as possible. It is

vital to our spiritual well-being that we be painfully honest with ourselves in this. Because, if the second scenario is the truth with us, we need to tap into fear - fear of the Living God, because this second scenario is the first step in a process that, if its not changed, will drag us straight into the lake of fire. You see, we are beginning to wish that dark is a little darker - that black is a little blacker (the bad kind of black) and later we'll want to see gray as black and, eventually, to see white itself as black. Finally, we will insist on the most negative situation. We will insist on seeing everyone and everything - God, our loved ones, even ourselves as bad. And we will not be able to stop doing it: We will be chained forever in a universe of pure hatred.

Sound far-fetched? It is not. I know people like this. Some of you probably do too. You can't even carry on a conversation with them without them spewing negative all over you. They speak of their wives, husbands and children like that – themselves and even God like that.

We are allowed to condemn an enemy's acts and hate those acts but remember, we were created to live forever and it is those little marks on our insides that will determine if our eternity is going to be in the smoking section or the nonsmoking – whether we are at home with the Lord or more at home in hell. That feeling of bitterness, of resentment, of wanting to get back at someone must be killed. It must be nailed to the cross.

Most of us can't just decide this minute that we will never feel it again. Instead, we need to be ready and every time it bobs its head up, day after day, year after year, however long it takes, and hit it on its ugly head – Pow! Its not impossible. It will become easier with time.

We need to feel about our enemy as we feel about ourselves in that way – that we wish she were not bad, hope she can be cured – to wish good to her. That is what the Bible means by "loving her.": wishing her good, not feeling fond of her or saying she is nice when she is not.

Of course, this means loving people who have nothing lovable about them. But does **your** self have anything

lovable about it? You love it because it is **your** self.

There is the kicker. Do you love yourself? God intends us to love all selves in the same way and for the same reason. It is so important that we see this that he has shown us what it looks like: we simply look at the way we do this with ourselves. He has shown it to us in ourselves to see how to do it with others. None of this works, however, if we do not love ourselves. Does this mean that, if we do not love ourselves, we cannot love others? I'm afraid that it does.

God loves us in this same way. I mean there is nothing in us that is lovable. God does not love me because I deserve it, because I am doing what he wants me to, because I love him, or because I am lovable. God loves me as an expression of who He is (see I John 4:8). He created us. There is nothing else in us to love — we creatures who can actually find hatred such a pleasure that, to give it up can be like trying to give up a drug addiction.

Love your neighbor as you love yourself!

## The First Servant's Fellowship

On the 12<sup>th</sup> of February church leaders of the Whole Body of Christ Alliance met to plan the first monthly meeting of what they decided to call the SERVANT'S FELLOWSHIP. It was decided that the meeting would take place on the Second Saturday of each month

On Saturday 12 March the meeting took place at Living Hope Christian fellowship in Hoschton.

Eleven ministries of the 22 that are presently part of the Whole Body of Christ Alliance (the number grows weekly) were represented at the meeting.

A whole lot of ministering went on there. It was a privilege to be present for it.

Russell Page of Kingdom Realm spoke about Helping Hands Ministry, which supplies people in need with clothing, toys, dishes and other necessities as well as Heavenly Host Ministry, which exists to help the homebound get places they need to go, provides breaks for primary care givers and other things.

He also brought up for discussion a seven-day revival at seven different churches to begin on April 11<sup>th</sup> at Kingdom Realm and end on Sunday April 17<sup>th</sup> at Bread of Life.

Kenneth Cooper of Kingdom Community and Russell Page brought up for discussion a teaching and learning time on Saturday mornings for young preachers to begin preaching. This is to begin some time in April. It seems the plan is to have some of the veteran preachers present for gentle critique and for this to take place at Kingdom Realm and other locations.

Another idea discussed was the need for a coffee house ministry to take place in various churches once monthly on Friday or Saturday night. The need was born from the observation of one of those present who has been involved in the coffee house idea in the past and seen that people – even lost people will come to a coffee house who would never set foot in a church. "People get saved there." He mentioned. This is also set for some time in April.

Scott Bagwell of Braselton Tabernacle of Praise spoke about a ministry already in place there called Roman's Road to Recovery on Tuesday nights at 1900 (7pm). It is a 12-step program for recovery which, unlike modernday A.A. meetings, discussion of Christ is encouraged.

The Reverend Doctor B. Jamila Edmunds, a Christian Counselor, discussed Corbree U. C, a ministry for girls 8 to 18 at risk for Abuse. She shared that she dealt in her ministry with this as well as with those dealing with grief.

Walter Cleveland of Next Level discussed the need for serious youth outreach and Charlie Powell of Bread of Life talked about how to apply the Bible.

Before the meeting was adjourned it was decided that the Servant's Fellowship on 9 April would be at Next Level in Statham, at Kingdom Community on 14 May and at Kingdom Realm 11 June all at 1800.
