Pastor Johnny Williams of Hope Fellowship in Winder began the discussion in the support group. "Our current situation in life is a result of the decisions we have made. Until I take **full** responsibility, I cannot change. When a man refuses to accept full responsibility – when he plays the blame game, he shows that he is unwilling to make changes in his life. If I want my future to be better than yesterday, I have to get to the root cause and change my decision making."

"If I am not the problem," one man commented, "there is no solution."

"Romans 12:2 tells us not to be conformed to this world but transformed. Proverbs 3: 5-6 tells us to trust in the Lord with all our heart and not to trust what we think we understand and, if we acknowledge him in everything, he will direct our path. We have free will. We have to let <u>God</u> change us.

"As Christians, how are we going to help anyone get free of bondage if we are in bondage ourselves?

"That renewing of the mind becomes evident in someone's life when the **old temptations** are no longer effective. They are no longer effective because the person has a new way of thinking and the old temptations cannot match up to the new way of thinking. Roman 6 is very powerful. It says I am dead to those old things. You can offer a drink to a corpse but he won't take it.

"The inner man – the spirit is you, not your body. You only need that body so you can be here on earth legally. That is why the devil is here illegally. He is a squatter.

"I Peter 5:8 talks about this devil – this roaring lion. He can't devour all the Christians but he can devour some of them. The lion lies in wait for the weak one of the heard – the weak Christians who will not grow. He looks for those weak ones.

Pastor Johnny Williams is a licensed and practicing substance abuse counselor as well as the pastor of Hope Fellowship.

If a person recovering from an addiction is pursuing a relationship with Christ and needs a meeting where God is not the group, a tree, a door knob or some other god that they or someone else designed, or they have a desire to be able to speak about Jesus Christ without being told that Christ is an "outside issue," the support group at Hope Fellowship Friday evenings at 1930 (730pm) is a great place to be.



"Least of These is an outreach to those in need-being Jesus' hands and feet – anything from financial to food to the word of God." Ministry Leader Marty Starcher told BFN. The ministry is based at New Community Church in Hoschton and was started nine years ago by Ozzie Giles but Ozzie left the area and Marty was asked to lead the ministry.

"We prepare and serve meals to people at Metro Lodge and Project Adam. We started out at Hope House in Metro Atlanta, which is a program like Project Adam only there are about 70 men there. It was started by Mayor Shirley Franklin.

"There is a base-set of people that make the ministry go: myself, my wife Heidi, Allen Register, Ginger Hutchins and Pam Howe. The number of people participating in the actual project depends on the number of volunteers. The church also has a clothing ministry and once a month we have a clothing closet along with a free meal. The church gave us a Christmas offering last year to begin a 501(c)3. We will have a solid website by then.

"We normally prepare dinner for the guys at Project Adam every second Sunday of each month between 5 and 7pm. We prepare a meal at New Community Church every third Saturday in conjunction with His Hands Ministries.

"There was a homeless man at Metro lodge who was about 65. He lived in the woods by the

lodge. He had been there for about eight years. He told us that he actually had a real meal when we came."

"We helped a lady who was having a baby. She had nothing for the baby. We helped her out with some clothes and things for the baby.

"There was a lady at New Community who had no shoes for her children. Allen bought clothes and shoes out of his pocket for them and bought them a hundred dollars worth of food.

"Three years ago we only came to Project Adam on Thanksgiving but for the last two years we have been coming every month."

On 13 November a roomful of men in recovery enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving dinner prepared by the Least of These Ministries. At a separate table sat about a dozen women, children and guests. The men at Project Adam were divided from the guests as they are often divided from the rest of society for now.

Marty addressed the men from Luke 17, the story of the ten lepers. "Lepers went through life completely without human touch. Jesus said that the one man's faith was in his thanksgiving. The other nine were healed of leprosy but this thankful man was the only one that was made whole."

Each one of the approximately forty people in the room told what they were thankful for. One man spoke, "I am thankful for all the trouble I've been through – the trouble that God brought me through, for this place, and for being clean and sober. I am happier than I have ever been."

Just before the service began a lady sat beside this reporter and shared, "God said it's already done. He is working it out. He has worked some of it out. He said to step out of your comfort zone and know him in a different way. Stop limiting him and stand in expectation." It turned

out that this lady was operating in the prophetic. Her name is Christine Childress.

Dr. Kenneth O'Neal picked up where Dr. Lorrie left off: "We want our children to be consistent, especially in their obedience. We need to be consistent in our relationships and interactions with others. We need to edify them."

Pastor O'Neal then reminded us of the story of the three servants given a different number of talents in Mat 25:14-30. "What Jesus is asking for here is consistency."

"God also wants us to perfect our talents." Dr. Lorrie interjected. "For instance, when a writer goes to school to study English, this is investing as well."

"Phil 3:14 says, 'I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Jesus Christ.' This," Dr. O'Neal reminded us, "is consistency. Here on earth the currency is money but in heaven the currency is souls."

In Luke 9:57-62, Jesus encounters those who would serve him but they want to do it on **their** terms. Pastor O'Neal reminds of verse 62, "Jesus said, 'No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God.' We must be consistent."

There are about 30 people who call Shabach of Braselton their home church. Church leaders besides Dr. Lorrie and Dr. Kenneth are James Mays, Urita Hodge, and Christine Childress.

Dr. Kenneth O'Neal and Dr. Lorrie Richardson-O'Neal moved to Georgia from Illinois with an assignment: Shabach of Atlanta. It began in McDonough. They drove there for three years. There are now three locations. The first is in McDonough in a warehouse that used to be an auto repair shop. The second is in a barber shop in Midtown and the third is in Braselton in a doctor's office.

"These are all market place ministries." Explained Dr. Lorrie. "There will come a time in America when our present freedoms will be challenged and churches will be closed down. There need to be, therefore, safe places. These are being established now and no one will know because they will be doing business as usual with worship going on. We will be a reservoir in a time of trouble to supply the need in time of drought.

Some wonderful things have happened with this church body due to prayer and the incredible intervention of Almighty God.

A man, Mr. Johnson, had stage IV laryngeal cancer and was being treated for it. Prayer brought about his healing. He has been cancer free since 1 October.

The people of the church prayed for employment for Tiffany and Wade and God opened the door at the time of need.

Shabach of Braselton is planning Soles for Souls on Saturday 17 December in cooperation with the Atlanta Fire Department. On 3 January they are calling a 21-day Soul Fast – a fast of denying the flesh of carnal things – no television, smoking, negative attitude etc.

"The service on Sunday is not the regular Sunday church service that most people are used to." Dr. Lorrie says. "There we must do what God says to do. It is not focused on any one person (like a pastor), but on Jesus and we elevate him alone. It is praise and worship with no worship leader. Sometimes there is a sermon and sometimes not."

Cross at the Roadside

On 16 October Pastor William Pirkle of Living Hope Christian Fellowship in Hoschton delivered the last sermon of the seven-day revival. There were some great sermons preached that week but this is the one deemed by many to have been the best. It is presented here in the December issue so that it can be done more completely.

When it was time for Pastor Pirkle to ascend the pulpit, he did so and held up his cellular telephone to the microphone. "My wife and I are one." He announced. She was in Kentucky caring for her sick father at the time of the last night of revival. "Baby, are you there?" he asked as he held up the cell phone.

"I'm right here." Here voice came out very clearly over the sound system inside the large sanctuary of White Oak Springs Baptist Church. She remained on the line during the entire sermon.

"As a young boy," began Pastor Pirkle, "I was sent out with a bucket of slop for the hogs. It was not something I wanted to eat but the pigs loved it. I fed them because it was given to me to feed them. Jesus said to me, 'William, do you love me?' Yes, Lord, you know that I do. 'Then feed my sheep.' I feed them because it was given to me to feed them but I never feed the sheep slop.

"I am about to do something that would get me thrown out in some places, arrested in other places and killed in still other places. I am about to read the word of God.

"We read in Exodus 3:10, 'Come now therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharaoh, that thou mayest bring forth my people the children of Israel out of Egypt.'

"Sometimes God has to tell us something more than one. This was the case with Moses and it has certainly been the case with me and probably most of you.

"A while back I was driving down a road in my truck and I passed some fellows putting up a cross on the side of the road. The Lord spoke to me and told me to turn around and go pray with those guys.

"I thought to myself, 'why am I thinking that?' and I kept on driving. He spoke to me again, 'Go back there and pray with those two men.' At that point I realized it was not me just thinking it. I was still driving toward my original destination and he told me a third time,

'Turn the truck around and go back and pray with those men.' That was when I pulled into a driveway to turn the truck around.

"I sat there for a minute and I told him, 'I don't know what to say, Lord. They lost somebody there on the side of the road. I didn't know the one they lost.'

"As I turned the truck around I talked to God: 'God, when we get back up there, you're gonna have o show up. Don't leave me on my own.' He did show up.

"I went back and pulled the truck off to the side of the road and got out and walked up to them. I asked them to pray with me. There was an older man whose son it was that was killed there. There was a younger man also who was the best friend of the man killed. It was this younger man who had built the wooden cross. He had done a fine job and I, being a man who works with wood myself, told him so.

"When I asked them if they would mind praying with me, the younger man – the one who had fashioned the cross for his best friend said, 'Well I'm not a religious man, but I'll pray with you.' And the three of us stood there on the side of the road in front of the cross, held hands and prayed.

"Afterward, I got back in my truck and continued on down the road. As I drove the Lord spoke to me again and told me he wanted to show me something. He showed me a vision of that younger man standing in front of a large number of people telling the story of the stranger who stopped to pray with him. The Lord shared with me that many people will be saved on account of that younger man who was 'not a religious men.'

"God had to tell Moses more than one time but in verse 13 Moses finally turned his truck around when he said, 'What shall I say unto them?'

"In Daniel 3:14-25, Nebuchadnezzar wanted the three young Hebrew men, Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego to worship the golden image of one of his gods (probably Marduk) and, knowing the consequences, refused. They had already turned their truck around.

"I did not come here tonight by myself. God came here with me. Outside of God we can't make it. We have to have him on the inside.

"In Like 1:26-34 the angel was telling Mary of the birth of Jesus to come. In verse 34 she asked, 'How shall this be, seeing I know not a man?' Mary didn't have her truck turned around. In verses 35-37 the angel explains and in verse 38 she finally said, 'be it unto me according to thy word.' She truck was turned around.

"In Matthew 26:36-39 Jesus ends with, 'Not as I will, but as thou wilt.' The truck was turned around right there. All throughout the Bible from Moses to Jesus, they gave up their will and their lives were completely changed.

"Come on down and fall on your face and say, 'Thy will not mine be done,' and the impossible will happen."

"No harvest before the healing." She cried out. "Keep doing it. Keep doing it. No harvest before the healing of the body. I will heal my body and then the harvest. Keep doing it. Don't stop." "Could she be talking to me or am I just being self centered again?" This reporter thought. "These are the things I was praying about this morning. Only God knew what I asked him. No, she could not be talking to me."

Janet began reaching, still on her knees with her face to the ground. "Rick, Rick, Rick. Give me Rick."

There was no longer any doubt who she was talking to. The eyes of this reporter filled with tears and I quickstepped to the front where Janet's reaching hand took hold of my foot.

"Keep doing it, Rick. Keep doing it. Do not question God. It is my will. It is my plan. Do not question me. Keep going. I will provide for you. I will make a way where there is no way."

I apologize for writing in the first person but these are the exact words I prayed that very morning. No one knew but God.

"I will make a way for you where there is no way, Rick. Those men who claim God is with them are not as close as they say. The devil wants you to give up before the harvest. Keep doing it."

I had not had such a sign from God like this in weeks and no one in the coffee house had the slightest clue how powerful it was but me - not even Janet. My eyes dripped tears onto the floor and my nose ran.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Janet continued as Joyful Spirit began their third set. Janet prayed in the spirit over Rhonda Percifield and some others.

Avoiding Presumption in Prayer

I am Writing on a subject that will probably not be finished in this issue. I am not new to this situation, however, and neither are you.

God has created two realms of authority – the spiritual realm and the earthly realm. The spiritual realm contains what we have potentially and the earthly realm contains what we have actually received. These distinctions illustrate a basic problem in the Christian life: That which is spiritually, eternally given is not necessarily received or manifested in our lives.

Psalm 115:16, "The heavens are the Lord's, but the earth he has given to the children of men." According to the word of God, God rules in heaven. He gave the earth to men. But who actually rules over earth?

When man sinned in the garden, he rebelled against God and the authority over the earthly realm was given to Satan by default.

Jesus Christ came to take it back - to destroy the works of the devil, according to I John 3:8.

Through prayer we can rule this realm as God intended. It is the church's responsibility to rule. We must move the Kingdom of God to earth. This is why Jesus prayed in Mat 6:10, "Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

God has control of the heavens but man has control of the earth. War, suffering, and sin exist because we have not released the kingdom, authority and power of God in this lower realm. This principle is in operation in our praises. Psalm 149:6 instructs us, "Let the high praises of God be in our mouth and a two-edged sword be in our hands." High praise is when praise in the earthly realm is in harmony with praise in the heavenly realm. When we begin to worship in the same way and in the same spirit as the angels, as those in heaven, then our praise is no longer earthly praise and worship. Our praises have become high praises because they match the praise given to God in heaven. Praise becomes a two-edged sword that pulls down demonic influences in the heavenlies (II Corinthians 10:4).

I used to praise God by simply repeating the phrase, "Praise God." The Lord showed me a group of people sitting around a table and, after saying grace, the one who prayed said, "Eat lunch." Instead of actually eating lunch, everyone around the table kept repeating the words. "Eat Lunch."

The Lord showed me that, when I just said the phrase, "Praise God." My praise was in vain. He showed me that simply saying, "Praise God," is not the same as praising God any more than saying, "Eat lunch," is the same as eating lunch. He showed me that, when the pastor stood in front of me and said, "Praise God," he was telling me to praise God. He was not telling me to repeat what he said, and that, no matter how loudly I shouted, "Praise God," I was still not praising God. I was only talking about praising God – just like shouting, "Eat lunch," is only talking about it and not doing it.

As I read the word of God, I began to see models of how God is to be worshipped and praised. I saw it in the book of Revelation. Rev 4:8 gave me a picture of the high praise in heaven: "...day and night and saying, 'Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come." Rev 4:10 said, "The four and twenty elders fall down before him that sat on the thrown... ...saying, 'Thou art worthy, oh Lord, to receive glory and honor and power, for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they were and are created."

Those 24 elders taught me about praising God. They showed me things to do and things not to do. For instance, they taught me to get out of my comfort zone for the Lord. They fell down before him that sat on the throne. They did not worship him sitting on a pew or a chair. They taught me how important it was to get out of my comfortable seat regardless of what everyone else in the sanctuary was doing. I realized who exactly I was addressing when I praised God. I realized that, if I were in the throne room of the Most High God, which is exactly where I am supposed to be in the spirit, I would not be sitting in a chair while I was praising him. I saw that, when I did that, I was being completely, inappropriately irreverent to God. Those 24 elders showed me how wrong I

had been. Those 24 elders did not sit in a seat and say the words, "Praise God." They fell on their faces and actually told him why he was

worthy of praise.

He made me aware of something else I was doing as well. I realized I had to stop shouting "Amen" meaninglessly or throwing it out as a question like I was saying, "Don't you agree with me?" Amen does not mean, "I agree with you." It means let it be so. I learned a lot from those 24 elders

People, we need to make our praise match the praise in heaven. I do not want to pray to the Most High God sitting comfortably in a chair. If I am going to pray, I will do it with the reverence that the God of all creation is worthy of - on my knees or on my face, or at the very least, standing. I promise you, when you are before him in the spirit, you will not sit in a chair or on a pew. You will bend your knees and bow before him. You will have no choice. Let your praise and worship match that in heaven. That is when we will begin to release the kingdom authority here on earth and not before. Every request that we pray to God must be received before it is prayed. Prayer involves letting God talk. Therefore, we must be listening all the time. It is impossible to talk without ceasing, but we can listen without ceasing. Listening to what is coming down from the heavenly realm is the key to praying without ceasing.

When we pray, how can we receive anything if we aren't quiet - if we don't listen also? Pray and listen. Pray and listen. God's will - his instruction on what he wants us to pray for may come from an impression, a vision, a dream, a word of knowledge, or a scripture. How ever it comes, we will have received God's request from the spiritual or heavenly realm.

Worship and praise can tune us into what is important to God. As we tune in through worship, we will often be shown what we are to do about out job, marriage, children, ministry. It will have dropped into our mind. This is why it is so important to keep a prayer journal with dates and times. When God speaks to us with words, with a vision, or with an impartation of knowledge, or a dream, within a very short time- within days, weeks at the most - the communication will fade, not unlike the brightness of Mosses' face when he came back down the mountain from speaking to God. We will quickly forget the fine details, which we may see the significance of later and our earthly minds will tend to minimize or explain these things away. This is why it is so important to record everything in the most detail that you can as soon as you can.

Once we have received the request, two problems have been solved for us: The problem of knowing God's will for us and the problem of praying in faith. When we hear from God, we know his will. He has told us. And, when we have heard from him directly, we have had faith given to us, because, when he tells us himself, we have no difficulty believing. Then we cooperate with heaven by returning (praying) the request. Intervention in the earthly realm can only come as the result of some form of prayer. Prayer in some form - tongues, listening, worship, thanksgiving, adoration, petition - is the only means of releasing intervention on earth.

Neither the importance of prayer, nor the importance of knowing God's heart when we pray can be overemphasized. Lamentations 3:37 tells us, "Who is he who speaks and it comes to pass when the Lord has not commanded it?"

It is vain to confess in the earthly realm what God has not commanded in the earthly realm. We can say it a thousand times but, if God has not commanded it, it is in vain.

Before we confess something, we need to know what God's heart is. If we read his word on a daily basis, we have a pretty good shot at knowing his heart.

One thing God does not need is an abundance of words when we pray. In Matthew 6:7 Jesus said, "When you pray do not use vain repetitions, as the heathens do: for they think they will be heard for their much speaking." He does not need a dissertation about the request. We may be better off listening for five minutes than speaking for six hours.

Prayer is a conversation. We speak. We listen. It is to involve conversation with God. We cannot do God's part and God will not do our part. Our part is to discover his will and ask according to his will. Prayer is our harmonizing with heaven. Every miracle, every salvation and every baptism in the Holy Sprit is the result of this harmony.

PRESUMPTION is demanding that God act according to our will before we receive a request from him. Presumption produces unbelief because such prayers are not answered. People who presume of God ignore what conditions have to met and what scriptural principles are operating. God's heart may be completely different on a matter than my heart. If I have some unexplained back pain, I may

say, "I know God's will is for me to be healed. By his stripes I am healed. I confess that I am healed!" Nothing happens. The prayer is not answered. What's wrong? Presumption never considers conditions or spiritual principles. On the other hand, if I got down on my face before God, he might tell me, "You need to forgive seven people. Don't ask me to take away your back pain. Ask me to take away your bitterness and resentment." I am praying about back pain but God does not hear me because back pain is not the problem. My prayer is not answered because I am demanding God to do something without first hearing what God wants. That is presumption!

Presumption never considers conditions. We show up and start ordering God - we start naming and claiming. We start confessing that which is not as if it is without hearing from God. If we would dare to ask God what is wrong with our prayer life - and then listen to his answer – he might say, "You are sinning against the wife of your youth," or, "You have a resentment against your pastor," or, "You have a resentment against that child, or, "against some one in your church."

Not long ago, a woman showed me an old broken china doll that she had saved and told me she could not bring herself to throw it away, it was her favorite and she said, "My mother made me share it with my whiney little sister and she broke it."

"Have you ever forgiven her for it?" I asked. "No, I really haven't."

How many "No-I-really-haven'ts" are in your life? It blocks prayer. Presumption ignores conditions and spiritual principles - ignores what is on God's heart and, ultimately causes unbelief. When we name and claim and do not receive what we have claimed, we begin to the

believe there is something wrong with God. "I followed the formula. I did it 40 days in a row and nothing happened." First of all, just following "the formula" is nothing but ritual. It is the essence of tradition. Second, the problem is that we are demanding God do something different than what is in his heart.

Sometimes we get an answer to prayer serendipitously, by accident. I say it is by accident because we jump in and start praying without waiting to hear from God,

But what we are praying for is clearly God's will - at least in a general way, so we get an answer. What we are talking about here is a minority of prayer cases - at least for most people. An example is when we are praying for a lost person. We know that it is God's will that all should be saved. So, why in a case like this should we listen for God's input?

Even in a case like this, we need to hear from God because there is a huge difference between praying in a general way for a woman to be saved and praying a specific prayer - a tailormade prayer for that woman and find out. because we listened to God, that she was abused during childhood and, as a result, has had a number of sordid affairs; hates men, hates sex, and cannot relate to marriage. We may find out that the abuse she suffered was at the hands of a man or men who called themselves Christians, and as a result, hates Christians, hates church and is angry at God.

What id the unsaved teen you were praying for had been made to go to church, forced to feign worship of a God he does not understand and his mother and/or father criticized him at every turn? "You didn't have your hands up." "You weren't singing loudly enough." "You start worshiping God the way we show you."

What if the unsaved man you are praying for has never in his life known a Christian man that he could respect, a Christian man who actually lived what he talked?

If you prayed for the woman who was abused and wounded and, out of ignorance, continued to put herself in those same situations, and you took time to listen - to see what God wanted you to pray for, he might tell you to pray that a Christian woman sit down with her and work through these things in patience and gentleness and without condemnation or judgment.

If you prayed for that teenager and listened for God's input, he might tell you to pray that the boy's father go to him and apologize for cramming religion and churchianity at him until he rebelled against his parents by rebelling against the Lord.

If you were praying for that lost men, God might tell you to pray that a man might come into his life that was truly filled with Jesus - a man that he could respect. You might pray that, as a result of that relationship, he would receive Jesus.

You see that it's not always enough to say, I know it's God's will that this person or that person be saved," we have to get to the heart of the situation and pray a tailor-made prayer and God is the tailor.

When we pray that a person be healed, sometimes it is not enough t just pray for their healing in a general way: Lord, please heal soand-so of such-and-such." I was praying for a lady- that God would heal her of obesity, diabetes, and high blood pressure when I asked God to show me what to pray for. He gave me a vision. I saw a green glass bottle like a wine bottle filled with a disgusting black fluid. The stopper in the bottle was black and nasty. In order for the fluid in the bottle to be emptied out, the nasty stopper had to be removed and destroyed. The Lord told me the name of the stopper was Mara. Mara is Hebrew for "bitter." I knew that no matter what this woman did, she could not lose the weight that was causing the high blood pressure and diabetes. But, when I continued to pray and listen, God showed me that she could make no progress, and in fact continued to gain weight because she was unwilling to deal with the bitterness she carried around. She had to remove the stopper so the bottle could be emptied, cleaned, and refilled by God.

"I forgive so-and-so," she told me, "but I won't forget." I reminded her that Jesus said in the Lord's Prayer, "Forgive us our trespasses <u>as</u> we forgive those who trespass against us." The I asked her, "Is that how you want God to forgive you – forgive but not forget?"

When she was able to deal with that immobilizing bitterness, she was able to begin making progress losing weight. An added benefit to listening to this answer from God was it showed me that I had to deal with any

bitterness that I carried as well.

Do not be discouraged. God loves to answer prayer. But the prayer must be received by us from God before it is prayed to be truly effective. We ask God to give us what to pray. We must receive the request from the spiritual realm and then pray it back to God. When we receive a word from him, we know our prayer will be answered, because we know that it agrees with God (I John 5:14).

When we just jump in and pray for something without listening for an answer, and then say, "Amen," and get up, we are presuming of God. Remember, prayer is supposed to be a conversation with God, not a dissertation to an audience of one. Pray and listen for a while, then pray, then listen. He will speak to you.
