The area behind Love of God Mission was useless, overgrown with weeds, covered with mud and garbage. It was this way until Jack showed up. Jack Boring has been at Love of





These Ministries. He read from Mat 25:41. The ministry prepares food for the needy (e.g. at Project Adam)then bring the word to them. "In Jackson and Barrow counties there is great financial need," said Marty, "but also a great need for the Lord. We can do it, but more people could do more."

The speaker for the evening, Dorthea (Lovie) Allen, began, "As a minister of the gospel, I must remain teachable and do my assignment without excuses." Isaiah 45:7 says, "I form the light, and create darkness: I make peace, and create evil: I the Lord do all these things."

"Who?" asked the preacher, "I the Lord." Judges 9:23 says, "Then God sent an evil spirit

between Abimelech and the men of Shechem..." I Sam 16:14 says, "But the spirit of the Lord departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the Lord troubled him."

"In Genesis Joseph was born into a dysfunctional family. His dad was married to his mother and his aunt. His brothers said, 'we will kill him and then see what happens to his dreams.' But Reuben said, 'No, we'll put him in this pit.' He was sold to the Midianites and went to Egypt, where he was sold to Potiphar. With Potiphar's wife, Joseph found more evil. He went to prison. 

He gave it to us as a model of how we should pray. Then he prayed and afterward introduced Melanie Phillips, the manager of Atlanta Mission Thrift Store and More on May Street in Winder. She told of how tragedy struck the lives of her and her husband and how they lived in fear for a year but finally went back to church. "The thrift store, formerly The Potter's House," shared Melanie, "has grown from 4 to 7 stores, and they help about 1000 people a month. I manage a team in Winder of 3 to 10 people. We are blessed to be able to pray with whoever is in the store. The stores help support the recovery center in Jefferson, which provides a year-long reprogramming for addicted men."

After Ms. Phillips, Rick Hempton of the Whole Body of Christ Alliance spoke on the importance of unity in the body of Christ. He began with Psalm 133 and went to John 17:11, 17:20-21, "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in me through their word; that they all may be one, as you, Father, are in me, and I in you; that they also may be one in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." "Why do we need to be in unity?" The Rev. Dr. Hempton asked, "That the world may believe 'that thou didst send me."

We have this ministry and we have received mercy and we do not lose heart; we have renounced the things of shame. If our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. We all have a ministry, and we need to find it and do it. If we let the differences between us remain, we hide all of these things Paul writes of here. We need to get to where these differences don't mean anything. Jesus isn't down here but we are. We have to duplicate what he does – be his hands, his mouth. There is trouble everywhere, but there's good news: Jesus is everywhere.

"Our trials are supposed to lead us to the foot of the cross, and make us better, not bitter.

"We have to come together in agreement. Pray in agreement with someone. Pray it through. Put on the whole armor of God. We wrestle not against flesh and blood. We have to quit wrestling with one another. If we don't, we are on the devil's side.

"And having done all, to stand. Truth! We need to be in unity, not only with each other, but with God."

The music began anew. Pastor Patsy called for all who needed prayer to come to the front.

"I've failed. I've let so many people down. As a teenager living at home I clashed with my dad. I hated living there. I just wanted to have some fun. I was sick of doing everything his way. People always told me I should be like him.

Things just got worse every day. One day I was fed up and I told my dad, 'I Hate You! I wish you would die!'Oh, the look in his eye. He led me to the door, gave me a lot of money and said, 'Okay Son, I love you.'

"At last, I could do what I wanted. Every night was a party. No responsibility and oh, the

friends that money brought me, the drugs, the alcohol, and nobody telling me what to do.

"After a couple years, the money ran out, I could find none of those friends, and the life I lived was living me. The anger that built up pushed people away. I lost jobs. There was no where to go. Finally, I found myself surrounded with pigs - me, a nice Jewish boy. I was so hungry I wanted to eat that pig food. I remembered the last thing my dad said to me, 'Son, I love you. I remembered the hired help. They didn't even live like this. Maybe, just maybe he'd let me cut the grass - be a servant. I'll go back. I'll tell him I've sinned against him and God. He'll tell me I'm getting what I deserve and he'll be right. You reap what you sow. But at least I won't be eating this pig food."

The spot light went to black as the music played. A few seconds later the spotlight came back on at the other side of the stage.

"They're all excited he's back! I' am so mad I could spit! He's back after all those years. <u>I</u> cut the grass! <u>I</u> did all the work! Here he is back now and they're all in there having a party. I want him gone right now! I can't stand him! Everybody says, 'You have to help your little brother.' Nobody recognizes what <u>I've</u> done. Kill the fatted calf? I don't even have a blasted goat. They all celebrate because that piece of trash has come back."

The spotlight went to black once again as the music played. After a couple seconds the spotlight came on center stage.

"God has blessed me with two wonderful sons. When the youngest one was a teenager we went at it. My wife said, 'He's just like you.' I just didn't want him to have to go through what I went through. He blew up one day and I knew I had to let him go. He would have to learn some things on his own. I worried about him for so long. I'd just sit by the phone and wait. There was nothing he could do to make me love him more or less

"I had been praying for him and I was looking down the road. They said, 'Who is that?' I knew who it was. I ran down the road and threw my arms around him. I made sure he got a shower, clothes, shoes, and a ring on his finger. We had a barbeque. I was the happiest daddy in the world.

"My oldest boy has never given me a bit of trouble. I am so proud of him. He doesn't know it, but someday he's gonna be runnin' this place. He can really put away the groceries. He brings his friends on the football team and they will clean us out, but it's okay. He's my boy. He doesn't know it but I told the servants that if anything happens, it better not happen to him." Does anyone recognize this story? Luke chapter 15.

"The good news is that you don't have to come back to the Father as a servant, but as a child of the most high God. You have his royal DNA in your blood.

"The oldest boy did what he was supposed to do the whole time and he **thought** he was a servant, that is was a chore to be there. Some church folks are there – miserable, feel like God has let them down. They say, 'It isn't fair.' In the kingdom there is no such thing as fair. By our standards, the Father practices profound unfairness.

"I'm gonna have a Grace Party. I didn't earn it, but I get it because he loves me."

bring up the ark of the covenant from the city of David, which is Zion. The priests and Levites brought up the ark, and the tabernacle of the congregation, and all the holy vessels that were in the tabernacle, and placed it in the inner sanctuary of the temple. King Solomon and all the congregation sacrificed tens of thousands of sheep and oxen. Then starting in verse eleven, "And it came to pass, when the priests were come out of the holy place; (for all the priests that were present were sanctified, and did not then wait by course: also the Levites which were the singers, all of them of Asaph, of Heman, of Jeduthun, with their sons and their brethren, being arrayed in white linen, having cymbals and psalteries and harps, stood at the east end of the altar, and with them an hundred and twenty priests sounding with trumpets:) it came even to pass, as the trumpets and singers were as one, to make one sound to be heard in praising and thanking the LORD; and when they lifted up their voice with trumpets and cymbals and instruments of music, and praised the LORD, saying, For he is good; for his mercy endures forever: that the house was filled with a cloud, even the house of the LORD; so that the priests could not stand to minister by reason of the cloud: for the glory of the LORD had filled the house of God.'

Notice the priests had consecrated themselves. The Levite singers and musicians were also assembled there dressed in white linen, and had their musical instruments with them. There were also 120 priests there sounding trumpets. When the trumpeters and the singers became as one, praising and thanking Almighty God, the Almighty filled the temple with His presence. The glory of Almighty God was so great that the priests could not stand to minister. How very beautiful and awesome this scene is. Do you understand that the Almighty appeared in great power and glory as they became one? Division is a very key ingredient hindering the work of the kingdom. I cannot overemphasize the importance of this factor. The corruption of division taints things, that Almighty God in his holiness and purity holds back His great power from this devil-devised scheme. It is devilish, sensual, and filled with pride. Remember, pride goes before destruction, and not before a great display of power from the Almighty. If we desire to see His great power, we must humble ourselves instead. Acquiring singleness of mind with our brethren throws the door wide open to receive great and mighty things from on high. Coming into agreement creates a sweet sweet environment in which the Holy Spirit delights to work. Making and maintaining denominational division has the tendency of quenching the Holy Spirit. Let him that hath an ear to hear, listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying. The Almighty loves unity among His people. He expects us to have a pure heart and to be as one. The Almighty will not refuse access into this powerful realm when we are one the way we are supposed to be: quite the contrary. He will pave a glorious entrance into that which he has for those who love Him.

Misleading New Believers

Without an understanding of sowing and reaping we give new converts to Christ a life-sentence of fleshly striving. If we preach the hope of new life in Christ, but fail to reveal the cross as the power to "put off the old man," they will strive to overcome, by determined obedience, what they've already struggled with for a lifetime. Only death with Christ can truly release them from bondage. All other striving will lead to frustration.

Resurrection Life is a Christian's Hope.

Our new life in Christ is to be the result of a resurrection, not merely a greater human effort. For us to walk in resurrection life there has to be a death of the old life.

Even though Christians in America don't have to face hungry lions and burning crosses, as the first disciples did, we are still commanded to pick up our crosses and die to ourselves. We are not to try to preserve our old life, even though our culture is far more tolerant of us than the culture of 2000 years ago was to the first disciples.

The Cross of Christ is our power against the old life and against our old life and against the reaping of corruption and suffering that comes from that old life. As I face what I am reaping in life and bring to death the old man who is reaping it, a new life is FORMED in me which will not draw to itself the reaping of things sowed in my past.

If we do not learn to appropriate the power of the cross to set people free from what was sown and is therefore being reaped in their lives, then individuals, marriages, and families, will never become what they could be in Christ, and we will remain ineffective against the rising tide of corruption in our communities.

Betraying the Cross

In many churches, even very godly people have become so frustrated with the human weakness and wretchedness around them that they are easily tempted to preach a "pick-yourself-up, brush-yourself off, and-just-start-making-the-Right-choices" kind of gospel. That message does nothing less than BETRAY the message of

Right-choices" kind of gospel. That message does nothing less than BETRAY the message of the cross to people who need to learn by example how to die to their old lives. Saints give each other platitudes of the personal testimonies of broken and crucified lives. We feed on eloquent sermons and beautiful songs instead of honest, gut-wrenching and sacrificial fellowship that leads to sanctification. We run to

seminars instead of living in life-giving community. How can a person get healed of lifelong wounds in a body that offers less love and fellowship than the family that originally caused the wounds? How can people get whole in churches that offer little more loving fellowship than the wounded found in school growing up?

This concludes this installment from Rev. Carr. Next month he intends to begin with a discussion of, "Isn't it all under the blood?"

Pastor Halbert began in I Chron 4:9 – the prayer of Jabez. "When we get out of our comfort zone, we get nervous. This is true for churches

too. If we don't get out of our comfort zone will begin to die as a body.

"There are 3 noticeable things about this prayer. First, the prayer is an oasis in the text in the midst of all the begats. He was not satisfied just to beget. Everyone in here can do something for Christ.

"Second, the name Jabez means, 'son of my sorrow.' Forget that. What does God say I am? Don't let folks call you out of your name. We don't have to drop below God's standars because we have already made that choice.

"Third, Jabez was more honorable than his brothers. He looked at what his family did and said. 'I can do better.'

"We've become divided and begun to build little empires. We don't have to do this anymore. Jabez prayed for prosperity. Money is not necessarily it at all. Pray, 'God, whatever you want for my life, that's what I'm asking for. Jabez asked God to enlarge his territory. He asked for influence that he could impact those around him. We should all want this in our lives.

"God is still a prayer-hearing God. He has already purposed in me. The good news is that God is willing to do the same thing with you as he did with Jabez.
