Almighty God Refuses Access

READER'S NOTE: There are many advantages To the body of Christ being in unity – many things we can do if we have it that we cannot otherwise do. We continue to lose battle after battle because we have not yet attained it. But it is not just a good idea; Almighty God commands it.

Mickey McConnell has written a book on the subject, Almighty God refuses Access, available through the Battlefield News. We have permission to print from it. Mickey has been a pastor, a missionary, and worked with troubled young men. He is a speaker, an author, and a godly brother in Christ.

I encourage you to read this passage in Mark Chapter 7, starting at the first verse, "Then came together unto him the Pharisees, and certain of the scribes, which came from Jerusalem. And when they saw some of his disciples eat bread

with defiled, that is to say, with unwashed hands, they found fault. For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat, except they wash their hands with the fist-hard-scrubbing, holding the tradition of the elders. And when they come from the market, except they wash, they eat not. And many other things there be, which they have received to hold, as the washing of cups, and pots, brazen vessels, and of tables, then the Pharisees and scribes asked him, Why walk not thy disciples according to the traditions of the elders, but eat bread with unwashed hands? He answered and said unto them, Well hath Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me. Howbeit in vain they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men. For laying aside the commandment of God, you hold the tradition of men, as the washing of pots and cups: and many other such things like you do. And he said unto them, full well you reject the commandment of God, that you may keep your own tradition." Notice in verse 7 the phrase, "teaching for doctrines the commandments of men." This is an extremely important concept. Any Christian, or any Christian Church, that exceeds what the Holy Bible says, is in error. We are not bound by Almighty Men to keep the commandments of men in the church. You and I are bound to keep the commandments of Almighty God. Notice the phrase in verse 9: "full well you reject the commandment of God, that you may keep your own tradition." Denominations are guilty, guilty, guilty of this very thing. They teach for doctrines the traditions of men. Many of these traditions of men are easily exposed by the scriptures; and yet, these denominational people insist that their people must adhere to these things. Notice in verse 8 the phrase, "for laying aside the commandment of God, you hold the tradition of men." Denominational people often put more emphasis on their tradition than they do on what is Almighty God's commandment on the same subject. If you read on down through verse 13, you will find, that these religious zealots had virtually bypassed the fifth commandment to honor father and mother, and felt completely justified in doing so, because of their tradition. Christ called this practice exactly what it is in verse 9: "rejecting the commandment of God."

What you need to know here also; is that a tradition is something that is handed down from generation to generation. In time it is treated as something that is mandatory from Almighty God. No one remembers how it got that way, but you had better think twice before you dare mess with it, for it is treated as holy. A tradition of men is not holy! It is only a tradition of men, no more and no less. If Grandpa practiced a certain tradition, then may Almighty God have mercy on you if you do not continue in the same. (This last sentence is sarcasm.) Did you get the picture here? It does not matter if the tradition is half biblical, or not biblical at all, it has come to be treated as a sacred thing that had better not be tampered with. Christ is making it crystal clear that many traditions make the commandments of Almighty God "of none effect." Such traditions are sinful, or the Almighty would not have talked about them this sternly. I invite you to carefully read over the passage again, and again, until you sense the passion and urgency with which Christ was talking about traditions of men. If a man from

Almighty God comes along and points out the error of such a tradition, he will virtually be committing ministerial suicide, for those who hold to such a tradition will attack him viciously, and I mean viciously. Many denominational doctrines that define a denomination, are half-truth doctrine traditions of men that make the commandments of Almighty God "of none effect." The fact that they are half-truths makes them unspeakably troublesome, for they have come to be deeply seated traditions. When some truth is mixed with a tradition, it is virtually impossible to correct the error. Religious zealots will see to it that you are castigated and branded as a troublemaking cancer that must be cut out. When this happens, a prophet from the Almighty is treated as the devil himself. Good people will stone him, thinking they are doing Almighty God a service. Not all traditions are bad, but the ones that war against the Almighty and his kingdom must be forsaken. They create division and destroy unity.

Isaiah 54:1-3 was where Pastor Livingston began, "Sing, Oh barren... ...and thy seed shall inherit the gentiles"

"I John 3:2 says, '...when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him like he is.' Unless we are renewed in our minds, we will not change. Everything God touches is transformed. When you've got God, the devil will start messing with your mind. You are not a sprinter. You are a marathon runner. We have all been delivered from **something**. In Luke we see when an evil spirit goes out of a man he gets 7 others and says, I'm going back to <u>mv</u> house. He thinks he owns you. He does not.

"People can inspire me, help me, but only God can transform me. In Heb 11:1 we see 'the **substance** of things hoped for.' Substance is matter. It takes up space. Therefore faith takes up space and it sets up for what God is gonna do. It reconstructs the container. When you got saved, you only held a quart, but now you've been expanded. My ability to change has expanded.

"Evidence: I don't see it with my natural eye and sometimes I don't feel like God is still gonna do it. Thank God that faith and answered prayers don't depend on what you feel.

"When we wait on God, we wait in motion," He said hopping up and down, "not in e-motion."

"A man was told to push on a huge rock and he did it day and night. He said, 'God you told me to move this rock and I haven't moved it one inch.' God said, 'I never told you to move it. I told you to push on it, and now, because you have, you have changed.'

message but Jesus. It seemed to this reporter such a metaphor to watch these street preachers shouting the gospel message to a seemingly deaf and blind world, preaching their hearts out to hundreds of deaf ears.

Discussed in the gazebo before the preaching began was those people, pastors and church folks who cannot fellowship with other Christian brothers and sisters because their "doctrine" is not the same, because of some minor difference in beliefs, although the things that Jesus taught are the same for both. The discussion was about how, when the standoffish church holds the difference against the other brothers and sisters, it is never done with any thing like the love of Christ. It is almost as if the old meanness of the flesh has never gone away from them and they have found what they believe to be a legitimate excuse to allow themselves what to them is pleasure in meanness. A religious spirit is the meanest spirit there is.

Someone quoted Jesus in Mat 12:35 saying, 'A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things.'

The discussion involved churches that believe that they are the only ones with the truth and will not associate with another church because that church believes, for instance, that Baptizing by sprinkling instead of immersion is acceptable.

One of the men there said that was a minor difference that could be worked through with love, and when we reject our brothers because of these, we are Pharisees, without the love of Christ, to whom Jesus said in Mat 23:24, 'you blind guides, you strain at a gnat and swallow a camel.' It was quite a discussion.

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Be Not Deceived...

The Cross is Our Remedy

For individual lives that are in bondage to old attitudes, habits and patterns, denial of our roots (often very bitter) is not the answer. Even new disciplines and better choices are sadly not the answer either.

The only effective and life-changing answer for the human condition is the cross of Christ. I must be crucified with him, and his life must be FORMED in me. His life is FORMED in us, not just subscribed to, aspired to, or even imitated. In the next few pages, I offer an illustration of what I am saying about sowing and reaping with the stories of two women. Patti and Marcia represent the opposite extremes of the many different types of people I get to minister to. I have purposely fictionalized these two to prevent anyone from insult or injury. Patti and Marcia are both the same age, and they both "got saved" at the same time in their life. You'll quickly see that the similarity between them ends there.

Positive Patti

Patti was the first born child of two very attractive, energetic, intelligent, and successful parents. They loved each other deeply, and they both rejoiced greatly over the news that Patti's mom was pregnant with her. Patti was not only fortunate enough to be the first child, but she was also the first and only grandchild for nine vears.

Nearly Perfect Parents

Her dad was a successful doctor, as his father had been. Her mom's father was a very gifted college professor, and his wife was a very creative and contented housewife. Patti's mom had a degree in early childhood education, but she had always hoped to have a family rather than her own career. Her husband's high income afforded her the ability to stay at home with her daughter, where she delighted over every new gesture, expression, discovery, accomplishment as Patti grew.

By the time Patti went to school she was pretty, well-mannered, well-dressed. confident. intelligent, and very outgoing. Because of all the love and attention she had received, she was thoroughly convinced that she was a joy to everyone in her extended family. As a result, Patti was also very popular both with teachers and other students throughout her school years. She excelled in both academics and sports, and was always recognized as a valuable asset in any club or group.

Her Little Sister's Idol

At nine years old on Christmas, Patti was delighted when her mom and dad "gave her" a little baby sister. Patti was a very enthusiastic care-giver, and rapidly became a very capable "mother's helper." Her greatest thrill would come when her little sister cried out for Patti to hold her or to feed her instead of her mother.

As her little sister grew, she tried desperately to imitate all that Patti did or said from very early infancy. Her efforts thoroughly delighted Patti until her little sister was about eight. Pattie was then 17, and very caught up in the activities of her junior and senior years of high school. Patti became very unavailable to her little sister, who suddenly felt very rejected and lost. For that Patti always felt very guilty but it seemed unavoidable. Besides, her sister had more of Mom now, didn't she?

Soon college took Patti further away. Again she quickly established herself as an excellent student, and an officer in her sorority and other clubs. After graduation with highest honors, Patti also enjoyed rapid success in her first six years in the workplace. Then at 28 years of age, while surprisingly still single, Patti was invited to church by two new colleagues from her office.

"If we are Christians, we should not be bound by anything. The blood has already paid for it. People don't live the way God wants because they don't think the way God says. James 4:7 says, 'Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.' You don't resist the devil because you don't submit to God. You cannot love God and not love his word.

"Christianity was never intended to be a religion. He came to give us hope, to give us a relationship, to seek that which was lost.

"We are told not to be worried. Nobody is worried about what's going on. Facts will never change the truth, but the truth will change facts.

"Walk in love. Kingdom people are not the same as judgmental, legalistic church folks, who do not act out of love. Kingdom people walk to a different drum beat. The world needs to see Jesus in those that claim to know him. Church folks don't know him. They only know the law, not the love. The only time you should look down on somebody is when you're helping them up. Remember, you came from down there.

"Ephesians 6:10 says, 'Be strong in the Lord.'
"I am not for everybody, but I am for somebody because I am anointed for that. You are not for

everybody because everybody will not listen to you, but the ones you were put here for will listen to you."

Pastor Larry Pruett of Emmanuel Worship Center spoke next. "I was quickened in God while Pastor Johnny was speaking. It's not pride, but confidence in God. I am not **com**plaining, just **ex**plaining. Know that truth kisses righteousness and that love without truth is hypocrisy, and truth without love is brutality." Pastor Pruett introduced Clint Jones, who spoke next.

"No one has changed the world," said Clint Jones, "like that Jewish carpenter and the men who followed him, who 'turned the world upside down.' In the old days they would cover the word with honey and let the children lick it off that they would find the word as delicious as the honey.

"The world looked at those men then and said, 'I would never have chosen **them.** They have too many flaws, too many faults.' The world would look at those who are here right now and say, 'I would have never chosen them. They are too flawed, they have too many faults."
