# On Prayer 37 For Personal Holiness (Part One)

How does sinfulness affect prayer? How about the way holiness affects our prayer life? People sometimes don't realize how many different things affect our prayers. But they always drive us back to God. We will examine some verses that may feel negative, but force us to be realistic, as well as some other verses that are more positive and give us hope. A battery has both a negative and a positive side. Both are needed for the power to flow.

The Lord has much to say about how he reacts to prayer. Prov 15:8 says, "The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord, but the prayer of the upright is his delight." Prov 15:29 says, "The Lord is far from the wicked, but he hears the prayer of the righteous." Prov 28:9 says, "One who turns away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be an abomination."

It would be difficult to find a more descriptive word than 'abomination.' If I decided to turn my ear away from what the scripture says, God would say, 'Okay, Mozelle, your prayer is an abomination to me.'

We too often pray for 'her' and 'him' and 'them.' But the problem is not with our brother or sister or pastor; it is with us. The Lord wants us to be quiet and listen to what he says about how we pray.

Jeremiah talks about those who wander:

"Thus says the Lord to his people: Thus they have loved to wander; they have not restrained their feet. Therefore the Lord does not accept them; He will remember their iniquity now, and punish their sins."

Then the Lord said to me, "Do not pray for this people, for their good. When they fast, I will not hear their cry; and when they offer burnt offering and grain offering, I will not accept them. But I will consume them by the sword, by the famine, and by the pestilence." (Jer 14:10-12).

Here Jeremiah is told **not** to pray for Israel.

I can just hear someone say, "Well, that's Old Testament." Okay, then let's consider this from the New Testament:

"He who would love his life and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips from speaking deceit. Let him turn away from evil and do good; let him seek peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayers; but the face of the Lord are against those who do evil. (I Pet 3:10-12)

Whether we want to admit it or not, it is possible to reach the position where God's face is against us.

If we can receive a warning, it will take us to the place of repentance and prayer. I John 5:16-17 is a warning:

"If anyone sees his brother sinning a sin that does not lead to death, he will ask and He will give him life for those who commit sin not leading to death. There is sin leading to death. I do not say that he should pray about that. All unrighteousness is sin, and there is sin not leading to death."

There is sin that leads to death, and we are not to pray about this. What is sin that leads to death? Is it blasphemy of the Holy Spirit? Is it adultery? Is it stealing from church finances? Is it breaking one of the Ten Commandments?

Whenever a person persists in any state of willful disobedience, any of those sins can be a sin causing God to bring his life to an end.

A popular preacher once traveled across the country, committing adultery from town to town. He developed cancer and died in two month. No one could have prayed him back to health because he was sinning a sin unto death. Another famous preacher began to drink. A prophet of God told him to repent of the alcoholism or the Lord would remove him. He refused to repent, had a car accident and died. There is sin unto death.

Many of us get on our knees and say something like, "Oh, God, what is wrong? Why aren't you answering my prayer?" We fail to look at these verses that deal with the consequences of sin. They are not positive, and sometimes all we want to hear is fluff.

I am not saying that everyone who dies is sinning, but there is sin that leads to death because the Bible talks about it. Sometimes it seems like the Lord would say, "It's just like Jeremiah – you can pray all you want, I'm going to remove them because they are a reproach to my name and the church."

John (I John 4:20-23) writes, "For if our heart condemns us, God is greater than out heart, and knows all things. Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence toward God. And whatever we ask we receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do those things that are pleasing in his sight. And this is his commandment: that we should believe on the name of his son Jesus Christ and love one another, as he gave us commandment."

We receive answers because we are obedient and pleasing to the Lord Jesus Christ. Does your heart condemn you? If so, the Bible says that God is greater than your heart. If my heart is condemning me over the way I lived this week, God is greater than my heart — if I am condemning myself, what is God thinking?

We need to understand God's view on holiness in regard to prayer. If you are not holy, that is where to start – with your prayers.

Ps 66:18-20 says, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear. But certainly God has heard me; he has attended to the voice of my prayer. Blessed be God, who has not turned away my prayer, nor his mercy from me!"

That is positive, first of all, verse 18 talks about reality: Is there iniquity in my heart? If someone has a sin habit, disregarding that habit, ignoring the seriousness of it, is the opposite of repenting. Whatever it is, we must say, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear prayer."

Many people may forget to read the 19<sup>th</sup> verse – the positive part: "But certainly God has heard me; he has attended to my prayer. Blessed be God, who has not turned away my prayer.

If you are messing around with sin, you need to have a good repentance meeting. You need to get flat on your face – literally –and stay there until you can say, "Nothing in my heart condemns me."

# Almighty God Refuses Access

Notice these words beginning in Ez 9:4, "And the Lord said unto him, go through the midst of the city, through the midst of Jerusalem, and set a mark the foreheads of the men that sigh, and that cry for all the abominations that be done in the midst thereof. And to the others he said in my hearing, You go after him through the city and smite; let not your eyes spare, and neither have you any pity. Slay utterly old and young, both maids and little children, and women; but come not near any man upon whom is the mark; and begin at my sanctuary." This passage makes crystal clear Almighty God's position on compromising his truths. This passage clearly teaches us that it is top priority to hate that which is abominable. Notice I said "top priority," for the ones who did not hate the sins of abomination were completely wiped out, and the others who sighed and cried because the sins of abomination were spared. The wise objective person must now grow weary of the fight against that which is abominable. Sure, there are many worthy pursuits that need our attention; however, being continually grieved by the sins of abomination must be number one priority. This passage shows that Almighty God was completely disgusted with the people who did not hate the sins of abomination. We must not allow ourselves to be pushed into giving up our resistance to what the world has decided is no longer relevant. Let us continue the passage in Ez 9:6, "Then they began at the old aged men which were before the house. And he said to them, Defile the house and fill the courts with the slain. Go you forth. And they went forth and slew in the city. And it came to pass, while they were slaying them, and I was left, that I fell on my face and cried, and said, Ah Lord God, will you destroy all the residue of Israel in your pouring out of your fury upon Jerusalem? Then he said unto me, The iniquity of the house of Israel and Judah is exceeding great, and the land is full of blood, and the city full of perverseness: for they say, the Lord hath forsaken the earth, and the Lord does not see. And as for me also, my eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity, but I will recompense their way upon their head. And behold, the man clothed with linen, which had the inkhorn by his side, reported the matter saying, I have cone as you have commanded me." Once again let me say, the Almighty is making extremely clear how he feels about the willful evil of the people. There is no mistaking what is being said in the passage. We do not need an interpretation on the matter. Almighty

God has always hated these things, and he always will!



of the world and it would cost you nothing," said Lem Minish of the Bridge Homeless Ministry at Unity on a Mission the Thursday of, "would you do it? Unity! Phil 1:27 tells us to stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel. 2:2 says, 'Fulfill my joy by being like minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind.' Rom 12:16 says, 'Be of the same mind toward one another.' The key is one mind. Do we all have the same goal? No, there are many denominations and every one has a different picture. These commandments mention no religion or denomination. What would happen if Christians became united? Think how we could change the world. Eph 4:3-6, 'endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in all."

"In closing," said Dillon Hardigree at Unity on a Mission, "Those who committed to working for

unity, don't forget to count the cost. Luke 14:27-28 tells us, 'Whoever does not bear his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. For, which of you, intending to build a tower, does not sit down first and count the cost, whether he has enough to finish it?' Ultimately, it is not just us; one sees us and is well pleased. He will bring this to completion."

"John 17:11," began Tony Bertsch, youth pastor at Jefferson Gospel Tabernacle and member of the board of directors of the WBCA, as he spoke at the Friday night of revival at Living Hope,

"says, 'Now I am no longer in the world, and I come to you. Holy Father, keep through your name those whom you have given me, that they may be one as we are.' Later in  $V_{20.21}$  Jesus prayed, 'I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in me through their word; that they all may be one, as you, Father, are in me, and I in you; that they also may be one in us,' and then he says why they should be

one: 'that the world may believe that you sent me.' Jesus in the Father and the Father in him this is what Jesus prayed for, so we need to pray for it — that we become one as Jesus and the father are one. If we are one with Christ, we can come together and be in unity."

"Thank You," said Missy Îler of United front Ministries and member of the board of directors of the WBCA, as she addressed those at Living Hope, "for being in unity and working the way you do. Gen 11:6 says, after God saw all the things that people in unity were doing, "And the Lord said, 'indeed the people are one and they all have one language, and this is what they begin to do; now nothing that they propose to do will be withheld from them.' We find reasons to stay divided. Why does it matter what sign hangs in front of your church? What color your skin is? What language you speak?

Pastor Joseph closed the service with prayer and benediction.

A word from Pastor Joseph: The West African State of Ghana was formed from the merger of the British colony of the Gold Coast and the Togoland Trust Territory. In 1957 Ghana became the first sub-Saharan country in colonial Africa to gain its independence. Dr. Kwame Nkrumah was the first Prime Minister and his party, the Convention People Party formed the government when Ghana became a republic in July 1960. Ghana endured a long series of coups before Flt. Lt. Jerry Rawlings took power in 1981 and banned political parties. After approving a new constitution and restoring multiparty politics in 1992, Rawlings won presidential elections in 1992 and 1996. John Agyekum Kuffour succeeded him and was reelected in 2004. Prof John Atta-Mills took over as head of state, having won the 2008 election. The demise of President Mills brought in his Vice-president John Mahama as acting president, who went on to win the 2012 election and was inaugurated as President in January 2013. We remember the uncertainty the nation went through as the last election that brought President John Mahama to office was challenged by the main opposition party, the New Patriotic Party. The Supreme Court of Ghana, in the landmark decision, ratified the election results and all concerns and chaos died.

The main speakers were the reverend Lisa Echols, and Dr Carol Stephens. Worship music was led by the reverend Rusty Echols with Brother Micah on the keyboard. The conference began and did not close until almost 2300 (11pm) the Holy Spirit moved in that place and people's lives were changed forever.

"Some of us went through some warfare this week," began Sister Lisa, "and we were about to take some land! A few years ago I was ready to walk away from my ministry, Joy Springs," she explained. "Sometimes it's so intense that you just have to say, 'God is with me!" She prayed, saying, "Close your eyes and shake off any heaviness that you might be feeling. Shake off everything that concerns you. Bless the people that are here that are together in one spirit. Angels are surrounding us and there's no room for a demon to be here! We thank you for the Holy Spirit and the anointing, and we loose

everything from the heavenlies. We declare blessings over our family and over our battles; we are the winners Lord. Amen"

"Of the stories in the Bible of righteous people," said Dr Carol Stephens, two of them were Zacharias and Elizabeth. The interesting thing is that the Angel Gabriel told them they would have a son. They were older, so they might have been surprised to hear this news. They may have thought it wouldn't happen. (Actually Zacharias was struck dumb until the child was born because he did not believe). They were also told to call him Yochanan (John) and that he would be full of the Holy Spirit all of his life.

"Now during the same time period Miriam (Mary) got word from the Angel Gabriel that she would bear a child named Yeshua (Jesus). In this scenario, convergence was Mary and Elizabeth they both carried a baby at the same time. Mary was about 14. She too may have been a bit skeptical about being pregnant, just as Elizabeth may have been. They both were walking miracles in themselves, however, and when both women got together the Bible says the baby (John the Baptist) leapt in her belly.

"God does not mess up! John the Baptist preceded Jesus. He was the one who said to repent in my heart of hearts, who was willing to suffer the shame of man. God counts those who man discounts, like Mary. Have you been baron, ridiculed, longing, empty, wondering what's wrong with you?

"Zachariah continued to go to the temple. He was faithful. Have you continued to walk with God despite what you've been through? What has the Lord given you that doesn't fit the norm? What is it he created you for? He knows the number of hairs on your head. We all have a unique footprint. We are going to have convergence in this place tonight.

"There are two groups of people present tonight. In the first group, you feel rejected or you don't feel like you fit the status quo. You have gifts that are different from those around you. You are part of a church, but you just don't fit in. You have war on your hands. In the other group, you have something in you that you feel God is birthing. You have something in your soul that you can't explain. He has a book in you. Write it down!

"How do you grow?" Carol asked. "You must love those that persecute you, those that put you down. Who do I need to know? Call them to the Army! When you leave here tonight you are going to walk in your Authority. The Lord is so delighted. But he is saddened by the people that have missed out. Heb 4:14, 'Seeing then that we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the son of God, let us hold fast our confession.' We are to hold fast, and hold fast to our high priest, who was tempted as we are also tempted. We all have something in common: convergence. When one or more things come together as one, they make a whole.

"There are sixty-three days before Pentecost. We are divinely here the 3<sup>rd</sup> month, the 12<sup>th</sup> day. God is going to take something in your life that is scrambled, and you will get something out of it. You are conceiving something supernatural. God will not let it be explained because he is still processing you. You may be in the loneliest times, you can't explain how you feel.

them that ,when you have inner wounds that need to be healed, you are open to find something to mask that hurt and pain or rejection and abandonment.

The first step is always forgiveness, because without forgiveness, there is always the contamination of bitterness. As Kimberly explained this, the women began to open and release their own stories, which actually began their healing process. They could all relate to the stories of one another, and knew they didn't have to hold back; they could be real and honest, with no judgment. Holy inner healing is only done by the Holy Spirit to bring forth divine healing and wholeness in Christ Jesus.

Kimberly also explained in detail how addiction is not a root, but the real root needed to be uprooted, whether it is abuse, trauma, abandonment, or something else. She told them that she would not be a woman of God if she had not been set free of that bondage. As the word tells us in John 8:36, 'If the son makes you free, you will be free indeed.'

"I could never be free," Kimberly said, "if I had not forgiven those who had hurt me. Unforgiveness brings anger, bitterness. rejection, low self-esteem, fear, worry, and sexual issues. Your healing and restoration will come through forgiveness. The past does not have to be your present, nor your future!

"Many are wounded and struggle and don't understand the real struggle. The struggle is the will, the mind, and the emotions. You must always check your spirit, at a check point! Check means examine something in order to determine, detect, stop, and slow down. Point means a dot or another punctuation mark. Jesus will take you back to the memory in order to heal and free you. Jesus does this in order to uproot the bad root and to plant the root of life, truth, restoration, and freedom. As the word tells us in Phil 4:7, 'And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.'

"It is not always an easy process discovering things that your mind blocked from childhood. or even adulthood. But once you are free, You are free indeed. I also explained how the devil will come to steal, kill, and destroy your true identity in Christ. At the age of 22 God revealed that the father who raised me was not my biological father, but in my eyes, he was still my father. I was also pregnant with my precious daughter, who might need blood. Because of this, the blood- types of all my family members was determined. Through this I discovered the revelation about my father. And felt once that revelation came forth, I felt I had lost my identity. Then later on in life, as I was delivered and healed, God showed me I needed to see that biological stuff in order to break the generational curse."

It was truly a blessing to Kimberly to go forth to pour out to those women her heart, how she once was delivered and began to heal and is now able to walk in wholeness.

"Once I surrendered to Christ and learned his that his ways and his thoughts were not mine (Is 55:9), I would apply his word," Kimberly shared. "Your tests are always a testimony to help encourage one another! Roots can be infected or prosper and I truly want to see you woman prosper and set free."

"Supplication is another kind of prayer. There are many examples in the Psalms. There is also corporate prayer, as in Acts.

"Prayer can come in **your** words, your language. It can also be in the spirit. This can be in tongues. This way we pray according to the will of God. You are speaking mysteries unto God. It helps you grow spiritually. You don't know how many demons you are scattering when you pray in tongues.

"There is also praying in silence. It is not usually recommended, but there are times to

utter silent prayers. Look at Mat 6:6. It depends on where you are and what you are doing at the time. There is also a time for loud prayer. See Heb 5:7.

"Pray aright? Pray as the Bible says we should pray, not what we feel, or what we think. It is praying without sin in your life. Look at Is 59:1-2. The Lord will not listen if you are living in sin. Read Ps 51. Do not take God for granted. Prayer is hindered by sin. He is a God of Love, but also a God of justice.

"Pray his word back to him like in Ps 118:7, 'I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord.' II Cor 1:20 says, 'All the promises of God in him are Yes, and in him Amen, to the glory of God through us.'

"Commit the scriptures to memory. You cannot pray it if it is not in you. These are words that cause God to come down into your life.

"Praying aright works better when you are in good company. Bad company corrupts. Surround yourself with people who will encourage you to pray. Without prayer, the devil will walk all over you."

We need to be praying before, during, and after trials come. 'Deliver us from the evil one.' God will provide us with a way of escape from the temptation.

There is nothing new to man that has not been struggled with by men. Our High Priest went through the same temptations as we do. He got through it and did not sin.

day. My maids and I will fast likewise. And so I will go to the king, which is against the law; and if I perish, I perish! They fasted 3 days! She knew God answers pray, but it often takes fasting. The entire Jewish community was in a fast. Hebrew for fast is (Strongs 6684) Tsum.

"Ps 91:1 talks about **dwelling** in the secret place of the Most High. How do you dwell there constantly? It is about **staying** in the secret place. When you heed the Spirit, overcoming the flesh through fasting and prayer,the benefits are seen in the rest of the Psalm, V<sub>2-16</sub>. To me the act of fasting builds spiritual muscle, like lifting weights.

"Is 58:5-7: This kind of fasting looses the bonds of wickedness and lets the oppressed free. If you believe this, you will not leave the same.

"We see in Mat 14:23 Jesus went up to speak to Father alone. In Mat 26:26-39 he went with his three talmadim to a solitary place to pray, then left them to pray alone. He went for strength

from the Father. His sweat became as blood. In Acts 2:1-4 they were praying in one accord, waiting, fasting. Then Peter quoted from Joel 2:28-32. When we are fasting, this is when the Holy Spirit comes. The Spirit of God will fall and empower us. My master, Jesus, fasted and prayed for 40 days. Fasting and prayer will take you into the very presence of God, the holy one of Israel."

# **Inner Healing**

You will not hear many Christians today teach on inner healing. A lot of Gods children are struggling and can't find that key to unlock so that they may be set free. In the natural, whether it be from childhood or even adulthood, many have been wounded, abused, rejected, and abandoned. They have sorrows, grief, anguish, are fearful, and have suffered trauma. The emotions that accompany these things are all heavy burdens to carry. Jesus spoke of this in his word (Mat 11:30). If you feel the heavy weight, it is not of God, and it's time to do a complete removal of all that oppresses you. God is calling forth the inner healing movement now.

A grass cut to the grass root is needed today. It has been suppressed too long. It has been covered up, masked, and swept under the rug. Now it is time to expose things to recover your

healing. He wants to restore your damaged soul, but first you must realize the love of God for you. This will help you open and receive the inner healing. Rom 5:8 says, 'But God demonstrates his love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.' Rom 8:32 says, 'He who did not spare his own son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?'

Let's break it down, and talk about what is truly a root. A root is a part of a plant that attaches it to the ground, typically underground, conveying water and nourishment to the rest of the plant. Convey means to transport or carry to a place, communicate, impact, relay, transmit, send, reveal, shift, transfer, bear, transport, and bring. If there is a root in your life of being abused, rejected, abandoned, a root of grief, anguish, or trauma, or even church hurt, it will attach and convey contamination. Then you will become stagnant and used by the enemy to make you motionless, inactive, sluggish, and /or dormant. You will not be able to move, or live, or prosper in Gods ways, thoughts, or plans because you must become healed and whole by the Holy Spirit first.

Mat 12:33 says, 'Either make the tree good and its fruit good, or else make the tree bad and its fruit bad; for a tree is known by its fruit. John 3:6 says, 'That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the spirit is spirit.

The enemy doesn't want you to recognize a bad root because he can use a damaged soul but he can't use someone with complete wholeness. God's word tells us in John 7:38, 'If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink.' In the uprooting process you must have a recovery strategy. God's word is a rooted plant bearing fruit. Stay active in Prayer (I Thes5:17). Be aware of the atmosphere and people who have contaminated you until you are healed. Follow through with the full instructions given to you.

Inner healing is a process and, as God instructs us in Psalms 46:10, 'Be still and know that I am God.' We must be still because it's crucial in this season that you don't get offended or you will miss it. Remember, you believe in something that is bigger than yourself. Do not disqualify the positive. Inner healing is a total decision. You **must** be 100% dedicated to your transformation process! It is truly what you have been seeking. It may not come in the way you thought it would, but God will bring it on the scene.

Matthew 7:7, 'Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; Knock, and it will be opened to you.' Rejection is a lie because when you received Christ you were accepted. The abuse is a pit that Jesus will bring you out of. You are not abandoned but adopted.
