On Prayer 46 **Corporate Intercession** (Part Two)

The anointing of the Holy Spirit must never be poured on someone's fleshly prayer. We must know what to do when someone's prayer is not of the Holy Spirit. Ex 30:30-32 deals with prayer because it talks about the anointing oil put on a priest:

"And you shall anoint Aaron and his sons, and sanctify them, that they may minister to me as priests. And you shall also speak to the children of Israel. Saying: 'This shall be a holy anointing oil to me throughout your generations. It shall not be poured on man's flesh."

A priest is an intercessor - someone who takes the circumstances or problems of another before the Lord. The Bible teaches that we followers of Christ are believer-priests (look at I Pet 2:5,9). When we pray, we want to come under God's anointing.

Balancing: on the other hand, never be arrogant as to judge or criticize another's prayer. They are allowing you to be part of a personal, sacred moment. If they are hurting, pray for them rather than criticize their prayers.

I was meeting with a group of people I love and someone started praying. I sat there criticizing her and God rebuked me. He said, "That woman is talking to me, and you are privileged to listen. Don't ever criticize another of my own while they are talking to me." I began to pray for that

When someone prays in an unwise or foolish way, they are most likely going through sorrow, pain, trials and tribulations. Their emotionalism may even be a symptom of their trouble. Everyone in that prayer meeting should instantly be praying for the person who is hurting or out of line. This way, instead of losing your prayer meeting to criticism and judgment, suddenly the hurting person becomes (silently, of course) the focus of everyone else's prayers. This is a very sweet way to deal with a serious problem.

Acts 4:23-31 is the only account in the book of Acts of a prayer meeting, what they prayed, and how they prayed. Because of that, it is a good passage to meditate on. The Sanhedrin had said in Acts 4:17, "Speak to no man in this name." In the following verse they "commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Yeshua." Then in V₂₁, the Sanhedrin threatened them with many threats. They warned against witnessing, preaching, public meetings, and mentioning the name of Yeshua.

The response of the apostles was to meet for prayer. First they found two verses to claim from the K'tuvim (the book of writings, including the book of Psalms). The first verse was Ps 146:6, which says that God is the creator and Lord of all things. They said, "God, you are in control. You can handle this situation." Then they claimed Ps 2:1-2: "Why did the nations rage... ...the kings of the earth took their stand, and the rulers were gathered together against the Lord and against his Messiah" (Act 4:25-26). In effect, they said, "The kings, Herod and Pilate, have raised up against your Anointed, Yeshua." Seeing that these verses fit their situation, the apostles prayed through them. But they only took hold of a couple of specific verses from a

Next, they presented two petitions. Instead of praying, "Get us out of this awful situation,"

They asked for boldness to go through it. Secondly, they requested signs, wonders, and miracles to confound the Sanhedrin.

These believers received ten answers to prayer in this one chapter. First, "The place where they assembled together was shaken." It was shaken literally, like an earthquake (V_{31}) . It was not an earthquake; it was the manifest presence of God. God is omnipresent, whether you feel him or not; feel or see it.

Second, God refilled them with the Holy Spirit. People need to be refilled with the Holy Spirit because they leak. One way to become refilled is to be part of a corporate prayer meeting.

Third, they spoke the word of God with boldness.

Fourth, they had compassion and love for each other.

Fifth, they shared everything and experienced total unselfishness. Communism says, "What you have is mine." Christianity says, "What I have is yours."

Sixth, they were of one mind, one heart, and one soul.

Seventh, they had great power. They very little revelation, but they did have great power, unlike the church today, which has plenty of revelation, but very little power.

Eighth, They preached the message of the resurrection of Messiah with power.

Ninth, they gave, and met each other's need sacrificially. Everyone who had a need was satisfied.

Tenth, they sold everything, and laid the money at the apostle's feet. They conquered materialism. That was a powerful prayer meeting!

Many home groups spend about half the time really praying for each other's needs and real situations. Everyone needs to be in some type of corporate prayer meeting. You are deceiving yourself if you think you are on fire for God when all you do is pray over your meals and on the way to work.

Daniel's Time, Times & 1/2 Time

This post explores math problems that were assigned to us through prophecy within the traditional historicist context. Let's start with a couple of Daniel's "time, times and an half" problems, and the mathematical probability of prophecy.

In one of Daniel's dreams we read:

1. (KJV) Daniel 10:1, "In the third year of Cyrus king of Persia a thing was revealed unto Daniel, whose name was called Belteshazzar; and the thing [was] true, but the time appointed [was] long: and he understood the thing, and had understanding of the vision."

You can Yahoo confirmation of the first year of Cyrus in Babylon to be 537-536 BC which makes the third year of Cyrus 534-533 BC Toward the end of this prophecy we read: (KVJ) Daniel 12:7, "And I heard the man clothed in linen, which [was] upon the waters of the river, when he held up his right hand and his left hand unto heaven, and sware by him that liveth for ever that [it shall be] for a time, times, and an half; and when he shall have accomplished to scatter the power of the holy people, all these [things] shall be finished." Jews - both Messianic and some that don't yet recognize Jesus as their Messiah - translation of the Hebrew idiom "time, times and an half" is somewhat different than most of we Christians

may have been taught. Below is the above verse from a version of the Tanakh:

Daniel 12:7 "And I heard the man clad in linen, who was above the waters of the river, and he raised his right hand and his left hand to the heavens, and he swore by the Life of the world, that in the time of [two] times and a half, and when they have ended shattering the strength of the holy people, all these will end." But hey, what would Hebrew scholars know about Hebrew idioms, right? While Jews understand the idiom in the passage indicates a factor of 2-1/2, they will readily admit their books and commentaries are silent in regard to just what a "time" is, and thus what the verse indicates 2-1/2 of! Most Christians are familiar with the following verse from the New Testament: II Peter 3:8, "But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day [is] with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day."

The Greek word that is translated as "day" in the above verse is "hemera". It is an ambiguous word, the definition of which, is determined by its context.

In 3 other passages in the KJV it is translated as "time" (in 12 verses in the NASB).

So if the Lord had meant for a "time" to be as a thousand years:

Then 2-1/2 "times" = 2500 years.

2500 - 533 BC = 1967, The restoration of the Jews to, and end of the Gentile control of. Jerusalem. The end of the "shattering the strength of the holy people".

Is this a one "time" wonder?

In another of Daniel's dreams we find: (KJV) Daniel 7:1, "In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head upon his bed: then he wrote the dream, [and] told the sum of the matters."

You can Yahoo confirmation for the first year of Belshazzar to be 553-552 BC

Later in this dream we read:

(KJV) Daniel 7:25, "And he shall speak [great] words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of the most High, and think to change times and laws: and they shall be given into his hand until a time and times and the dividing of time."

2500 - 552 BC = 1948, The restoration of the Jews to their covenant land, declaring an independent Israel. End of the Jews being given into his hand and being scattered among the "wilderness" of the nations. "His hand" being "little horn" (Satan via Gentile oppressors) from Zondervan Handbook to the Holy Bible -"Opposing God's people in different guises throughout history is the "little horn" (8, 20-21), until God finally removes its power." Yahweh's covenant people restored to their covenant land even while many are unfaithful and in unbelief, restored not for the sake of the unfaithful Jews among them, but for the sake of Yahweh's Holy name. Bear in mind that scholar's traditional dating of those two points in history, preceded

1948 (like Halley's Bible Handbook), precluding the possibility that the dating was manipulated in order to produce a desired outcome.

The probability of these two math problems being an accident, that spanned 2500 years in perfect parallel, while also being well supported textually, would be statistically absurd. Blessedly, there are even more problems that reinforce them. For open eyes these problems aptly demonstrate that it wasn't until after the dates of 1948 and 1967 had come to pass, and we entered what Daniel's prophecy calls the "time of the end", that we could confirm the solutions to these simple problems both mathematically and textually.

The book of Daniel was sealed until the "time of the end":

Daniel 12:4, "But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and seal the book, [even] to the time of the end: many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased."

God followed this up with a crystal clear statement of fact:

Daniel 12:9, "And he said, Go thy way, Daniel: for the words [are] closed up and sealed till the time of the end."

What a perfect seal God had Daniel put on this book! Not a seal that some man or religion could take credit for opening, but rather being unsealed by the simple passage of time and fulfillment of prophecy, at the right moment in time for understanding. In this "time of the end".

Isaac Newton: "This Prophecy is called the Revelation, with respect to the scripture of truth, which Daniel was commanded to shut up and seal, till the time of the end. Daniel sealed it until the time of the end; {Daniel 12:4, 9} and until that time comes, the Lamb is opening the seals......All which is as much as to say, that these Prophecies of Daniel and John should not be understood till the time of the end..... But in the very end, the Prophecy should be so far interpreted as to convince many."

(Part II. Observations Upon the Apocalypse of St. John. Chap 1)

Mathew Henry: Those things of God which are now dark and obscure will hereafter be made clear, and easy to be understood. Truth is the daughter of time. Scripture prophecies will be expounded by the accomplishment of them; therefore they are given, and for that explication they are reserved.

Church folks have unrealistic ideas of what a pastor should be doing when the Bible tells us in his word. John 15:16 says, 'You did not choose me, but I chose you.' You are being ordained.

"II Tim 4:2 says to preach the word. Nothing can substitute the word of God. To preach means to harold or proclaim. It is not my message; it's the king's message. I am speaking on the king's behalf. I may not like the message, but it is the king's message. To preach the word, we must study the word. The more I study, the more the king gives me. Why is this? I Cor 1:21 says, 'Since, in the wisdom of God, the world through wisdom, did not know God, it pleased God through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who believe.'

"The pastor's responsibility is to please the Lord Jesus Christ. The same is true for all of us. One day we will all give account to the Lord for the ministry. Don't worry about being the most popular; the man of God is out to please Jesus Christ.

"Rebuke, reprove, expose the sinfulness of sin. Rebuke the sinfulness of the sinner. We are our brother's keeper, to keep the soul from hell. Exhort and encourage them. How? When asked why someone would be interested in his books, Carey responded, "God has led me to design my books to have a two-fold mission: first, I wanted the stories to be interesting and personal. To that end, I've chosen places that were actual vacation spots with my family to be the settings for stories to play out in all of the books thus far. For example, we've been on many family vacations to Seattle, and that was the setting for my first book, A Walk Through The Market. My second book, A Walk Through The Mall, is largely set at the Mall of America in Minnesota. This was the destination of a long weekend for my family and I back in February of 2017.

"The second part of my mission was to create an interesting teaching device that's able to present biblical concepts in a straightforward, approachable manner. Unfortunately, the bible can be quite intimidating to those who are interested in reading it, but who don't really know how to get started. To solve this dilemma, my books are all interwoven with scripture in a unique way. For example, my first parable, Garden of Life – a parable about faith—which is set right here in Jefferson—has 180 passages of scripture imbedded into the story. If you think about it, that's more than many daily devotionals you'll find in Christian bookstores. These passages in Garden include at least one verse from all 27 books of the New Testament, and 15 of the 39 books in the Old Testament."

When asked how he plans to proceed with marketing his books, Carey responded, "I'm really not quite sure, yet. I've been told that my genre is unique, and perhaps ahead of its time. However, that doesn't stop me. Honestly, I never dreamed of writing books, and to be completely straight-up, if God wasn't involved in leading me to write these books, I probably never would have written more than what I need to do my day job or an occasional Facebook post. In other words, writing is not my passion. Sharing the gospel is my passion."

When asked why he started writing about spiritual warfare, he responded, "First off, to deny the existing of spiritual warfare all around us is akin to denying all spiritual things—love, hate, joy, anger, pride, etc. God made us to be

both material/physical and immaterial/spiritual beings."

How true.

He continues, "I began writing in 2009, a year after my mother passed away. Part of my motivation was to write about heaven, because I long to see mom again one day in paradise. But along the way-and I'm just like everyone else-I felt negative spiritual forces working against me and my progress to know Jesus Christ better. Anyway, on Independence Day in 2009, I started with a blank composition book, a spreadsheet of scriptures which I found inspiring, and a blank Word document. Sevenplus years later, and after many, many spiritual battles, I have five published books with several others in the works. When I think about it, in my simple life, this has been nothing short of miraculous."

Angie Burgess of Walk on Water Ministries spoke at the first night of the Fall 7-day.

"Jesus' first 12 disciples," began Pastor Angie, " had 12 different personalities. Two thousand years later the church is still here. Unless we live in solitary confinement, we all need to be reminded of the unity message. Ps 133 is a psalm of ascents. These psalms are about ours life's journey. We need unity because, in Ps 133, God commands the blessing. There were 15 steps up to the temple and 15 psalms of ascent. For the church to move with God, it takes unity. How? We are not waiting for a move of God; we are a move of God. As we all come together, we move from darkness to light, from shame to grace. We have broken hearts to heal, souls to rescue. How? Unity! There are hurting people to be healed.

"It is pleasant for brothers to dwell together in unity. It is better than strife. It brings the heart of the Father delight. We need to have mercy in all different growth cycles. When we see Jesus face-to-face, none of is perfect.

"The anointing oil was poured over Aaron's head (Ex 29:6). After Solomon, Israel was divided into a Northern and Southern kingdom, but the portrait of unity here is not lost on Israel. There 12 tribes on the vesture (ephod) Aaron wore. We are all one body. If we are sharing the body, we are sharing Jesus (I Cor 12:12, Rom 12:4-5).

"How are we going to bring the North & South kingdoms together? Mt Hermon and Mt Zion, through the pilgrimages to Jerusalem, they came together. It's okay to agree to disagree in love. God commands the blessing where there is unity."

Pastor Chuck Black of New Town Baptist Church closed with comments on Monday, the first night of revival.



"We talk about unity and working together and I hear some of the lamest excuses. You might need me and I might need you. We need to tear down the walls of denomination and be in unity. We step out of the boat, but then we see that storm and we take our focus off Christ. The scripture for you tonight is Act 16:25 - at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns. There was such a violent earthquake the foundation was shaken and everything came loose, the doors and the chains. The jailer drew his sword to take his own life, but no one had escaped. They all stayed and were singing. There is power in the name of Jesus to break every chain, break every chain, break every chain.

"Unity is what we breed in our children. In the 1990s there was a church split over the color of the carpet. Why? They did not have unity."



Pastor Scott Lance

Pastor Scott Lance of the Church at Hoschton spoke before opening in prayer. "Philemon is a small book in the Bible. He was a wealthy slave owner. A slave named Onesimus stole some things and ran away. The letter Paul wrote is the way we should treat each other. We are lifting each other up, praying for one another. God's people are working everywhere. We all have a common goal - leading the kingdom."



Pastor Chiquita Moses

Pastor Chiquita Moses spoke on unity in the body of Christ. "Romans 12:16, 'Be of the same mind toward one another. Do not set your mind on high things, but associate with humble.' Col 3:12-14, 'Clothe yourself with compassion. Bear with one another and forgive one another. Put on love. Love binds us together in perfect Unity.' What can we do to nurture Unity? We already know what Unity is. There are battles riside the churches. We must get ourselves right, reality check. Not being unified brings stumbling blocks inside our churches. Not being unified causes souls to be lost."



Eileen Minish of the Bridge spoke on unity in the body of Christ.

"Why is unity important? Eph 4:3 says, 'keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace.' God has called us all or we would not be here now. We want to see one church. God knew we were gonna be here tonight. He laid it on Rick's heart to build one church. All through the Bible it talks about unity, like when they walked around Yericho in unity. At the Tower of Babel they were in unity for an bad reason. The Gay Pride March attempts to make homosexuality look glorious and spectacular. We know that it isn't, but they are in unity, which makes them stronger, even if it is for a bad reason like at the Tower of Babel.

"Look what has happened in the last two years. We came against the government of Jackson County. We won because of our unity. God wants us to step out of our comfort zone. He wants it on earth as it is in heaven. How? We pray and seek his face."



Ms Ellie Cooper of Living Hope

"The first issue was six pages with no pictures," Ms Ellie Cooper of Living Hope Christian Fellowship told the people at Bush Chapel. "It comes out once monthly and it takes a lot of work. Rick and Jody do most of this. A prisoner in Macon wrote to Jody, 'Don't let this stop. It's a game changer.' This young man right here," she said, speaking of the Battlefield News, "will ride a jeep, donkey, boat, anything he has to. He will do whatever he must to get to the people. "In the good Samaritan, how many were in the ditch half dead? Yes, the correct answer is one.

ditch half dead? Yes, the correct answer is one. How many went by on the road beside him? Yes, it was three. Where did the Good Samaritan take the injured man? Yes, the inn. Which showed mercy? The Samaritan and inn keeper showed mercy. The Samaritan's job was to stay on the road, like the Battlefield News, and the inn keeper allowed him to do that. We are the inn keepers if we allow the Battlefield News to stay on the road."



Robert (Elwood) Everett

"When you look at each other, you are looking at a miracle. The Holy Spirit is in this place tonight. There is a reason that I praise him. It is not because of what a preacher told me, not even what a man told me, or even because of what the Bible says. We think he doesn't have time for our little problems, but the Bible says the very hairs on our head are numbered. This tells me that, if it is important to me, it is important to him."

"I always put a lot of prayer into this," First lady Wanda Stevens told the people at unity on a Mission. "God put on my heart: strategies of achieving unity. First, we need action. Strategy involves action. We can't wait for somebody else to do it. If we came to this revival and sat never speaking to anyone, never saying how awesome God is, what have we accomplished for the kingdom of God?

"Our major goal is to win as many to Christ as possible. We are to go to heaven and take as many with us as we can. So we have to have respect for one another, for the differences in our names, races, denominations, likes and dislikes, music. God made us different from one another in these ways. If we leave one little piece out, we are not complete. To achieve the most we can for Christ, it will take every little bit. If we put them all together, we have something beautiful for the Lord. If I bake a cake and leave out one ingredient, it might be edible, but it will not be all it can be. If we leave one person out, it is not all it can be for Jesus. Love on people. Show them his love through your love. Build each other up. Encourage one another; this is not supposed to be a competition. Our strategy is to be the most we can be for God.



Pastor Billy Angel of Kingdom Life Refuge

"In Gen 13 it took some unity for Abram to get all his stuff together and move out of Egypt. You can't have unity without somebody to back you up. You can't run a business without unity. Abram was rich in silver and gold. He went back to the place where he had been in the beginning because he had great substance. There was strife between Abram and Lot's people. There should be no strife between churches. Abram and Lot went their separate ways, but they were still in unity. When Lot was captured, Abram armed his 318 trained servants and rescued Lot. You must be trained. 318 is not much, but they were in unity. Sometimes I need help in my church. Where are my brothers? You might fight with your brothers, but when they need help, you come. You have to know who you are. Cezar Chavez brought the farm workers together in unity. The 13 colonies came together in unity. When the church gets into unity, it will change governments. We need to make the change, not the government. It was unity in 2014 in Jackson County. If your brother needs help, or his church needs help, we help. It is supposed to be on earth as it is in heaven."



Ms Ellie Cooper

"In Luke 10:25-37," began Ms Ellie Cooper of Living Hope Christian Fellowship, "what did the lawyer ask? He asked what he had to do to have eternal life. Then he asked, 'Who is my neighbor?' This gave rise to the story of the Good Samaritan. The road to Yericho was a very dangerous road, like going to Atlanta. A band of robbers got this man and left him in the ditch. A preacher (priest) went right by him, and then a church worker (Levite) did the same. Then came the dreaded Samaritan, who took the injured man to the inn. Which one between the Levite, priest, and Samaritan was the injured man's neighbor? The one who showed him mercy was. The Battlefield News is the Good Samaritan; it goes out all over the world, but it needs your help. It needs you to be the inn keeper.



through depression. I was supposed to be at a conference, but I didn't plan on going. I was signed up to go, however, and I know I didn't sign myself up. So the Lord must have checked me in. It changed my life. He knew that they were going to pray for me, which they did. They laid hands on me and I was healed that day of depression. God knew he had the right women there."

There are seven principles Margaret asked the group to write down.

- 1: Identify the enemy. Satan doesn't want us to succeed. If the enemy can sift us he will. He will go through our family if necessary, but it's okay to be afraid because we know who our comforter is Jesus.
- 2: Don't be driven by emotions. We allow Satan to manipulate our feelings and we don't make the right decisions.
- 3: Take your problems to the Lord. We'll make a mess out of it instead of going to him first. Prayer should be our first weapon not the last.
- 4: Admit you need help. Tell God you can do nothing without him. Surrender the problem to him and draw near to him.

Jody Bennett was asked to describe why we go through the storms and what gifts that we get from them.

"Storms bring fear, strength, and chaos. Storms bring peace, they don't last forever, and they can be a way of cleansing an area, whether it be an area of land or an area in our lives. The dictionary describes a storm as a violent disturbance of the atmosphere. When we are going through the storm, we should always seek shelter, our shelter is the Lord. We should run to him. Don't think about the bad weather, but instead, seek peace. If we don't go through storms, we don't have the need to call on God.

Our words are powerful. We have to be careful what comes out of our mouths. There are a few things that we say everyday that we should be more conscientious of and realize the power behind what we speak. In my office and around my family we don't say 'I'm busy' because it means: bound under Satan's yolk. And we don't say 'I can't.' Instead, we say 'You can do all things through Christ who strengthens you.' We also don't say 'I'm sorry.' This is a big problem for many people and they don't even realize how many times they say it everyday. You are not sorry! You are blessed and you are made in His image. Therefore, you might want to reconsider calling yourself sorry. Try changing it to something like, 'I apologize' or 'I didn't mean to.'

We all go through storms, but in the end, we grow from them. We learn from them, and it becomes part of why we were put on the planet. The peace that we have in trusting the Lord and waiting it out, surpasses all other kinds of peace. I speak this from my own experience.

As mothers, we have to be careful about how we react in our storms. If we completely freak out, what kind of example are we being to our children? They watch everything that we do, and more than likely, the way that we react will be the same way that they will react to situations. I knew a lady once that freaked out over storms. She would have her animals so stressed out because she was stressed out if a storm was coming. We have that much impact on others. It is important, therefore, for us to maintain a level of peace. This will demonstrate real faith, that we believe God will come through in any situation. As a mother, being around many teenagers, I know that I was put in their lives because they watch what I do and why I do it. They asked many questions. I know that I was put in their lives to answer those questions and build their faith. On the way to the conference, I was listening to Joyce Meyers and she said, "let Peace be the Umpire of your life. What does the Empire do? He calls the shots. So let Peace call the shots in your life today!
