On Prayer 48 Corporate Intercession (Part Four)

I want to challenge you now to join a corporate prayer group. We all need to be part of a meeting that has a regular schedule, interceding for our nation, our town, our home church, the churches in our area, our leaders and our children. And we need an outpouring of the Holy Ghost. Prayer should be so important that we will attend even if we have to miss something else.

God is calling you now to move from prayer to corporate intercession. It is the intercessors that will influence the lives of individuals and nations more than anyone. But you can only be an intercessor when you agree to meet consistently at a specific time with a specific group.

We need to become intercessors, not merely pray-ers. The Holy Spirit is saying, "It's corporate prayer time – move into it, fathers, mothers, and leaders." Make this article a seed, not a sermon.

Do you want to be an intercessor instead of someone who prays one in a while? Are you willing to be an intercessor? Then pray for it.

Biblical Origin of Islam

I'm going to refer you to a respected scholar to pull this all together because I simply can't state it any better. Joel Richardson, author and teacher of eschatology, describes it this way:

"So now we have this story: Ishmael and Isaac: Ishmael was a fourteen year old boy. He was kicked out into the desert but the Lord is faithful. He preserved him. He promised to make him into a great nation. So we read these things and they're interesting Bible stories, but what I'm asking you to do is to put yourself in the position to recognize the fact that in history, in real time, this was a real boy, with real emotions, with a real life. This happened to a little kid named Ishmael. And so what we need to understand is this: you have this little boy,

and he had a dad. He had a mother. He had a family. He had a life. He had an inheritance. And in one day he lost all of those things. He lost his dad. He lost his inheritance. He was out in the desert. He and his mother were on their own. And that brokenness, that woundedness, that rejection that took place in this little child, today has been passed on into the religion of Islam.

What do I mean? Mohammed, the founder of Islam, claimed to be a direct descendant of Ishmael. And Muslims today view themselves as both the physical and the spiritual descendants of Ishmael. And so we have the story, the incredible event that took place in this child's life. Two thousand six hundred years after these events took place, a direct descendant of Ishmael named Mohammed birthed forth a new religion into the world. And what does the religion teach? It teaches God is not a father. God has no Son. And, thirdly, Ishmael, not Isaac, is the heir with regard to the promises of God to the earth. The very things that those issues of rejection and woundedness and brokenness that took place in Ishmael's life were preserved in that line and two thousand six hundred years later, a man named Mohammed went into a cave, had an incredibly dark encounter with some sort of spiritual being. It choked the life out of him to where he felt as though he was going to die. Three times this presence came over him and it demanded that he recite. The third time, the words of the Qur'an begin to flow forth from Mohammed's

Mohammed, himself, literally believed that he was demon-possessed. He was suicidal. He was terrified.

After that, he ran home to his wife, who eventually convinced him he was a prophet of God. This is the origin of Islam. In a spiritual sense, Islam is the broken, bitter cry of Ishmael."

Ministering to Millenials

(from pg 1)

"What do we need to know and do to be relevant to the times? We need to be like the men of Issachar, 'who understood the times and knew what Israel was to do' (I Chro 12:32). We need to address 7 areas of ministry to stay current.

"1: **People**: Understand Millenials (born between 1984 & 1998) with their issues, interests and needs. This generation is less likely to read or trust the Bible than any other. More than ½ (55%) are 'Bible neutral' or 'Bible skeptical.' Yet Christian youth who go to church and care about their faith may know the Bible better than older Christians. Practicing Christian Millenials are more likely to believe the Bible came from God and read it multiple times per week than any other generation. In fact, the way practicing Christian Millenials engage with the Bible looks a lot like their parents and grandparents do.

"2: **Programs**: Design the programs of your church to address the needs and interests of Millenials. They want programs of spiritual and biblical substance. They want the church to be relevant. They don't want to know God as their buddy, but long for transcendence to know God as great and powerful and that he has purpose for their life. Millenials don't want to be busy doing things all the time; they want to come to church and discuss their faith with others. Millenials want to hear challenging messages and think through difficult truths and issues of our day. Millenials who are mentored by older believers are more likely to stay in church.

"3: Participation: Millenials want to be active in ministry, not spectators. They want to lead in worship, outreach ministry, mission trips, and small groups. They want to dialog in Bible study, not be lectured to.

"4: **Praise**: Modernize your music and let young people lead the main worship services. Stay current with the music.

"5: **Presentation**: Modernize your art, architecture, and dress. Millenials like simple dress, retro art, media graphics, and social

media. They can tell you exactly what you need to do to reach them and modernize your ministry.

"6: **Preaching**: Speak to their issues. They like to connect the Bible with real life issues, especially topics on relationships, cultural issues, and biblical values. Use media to support your preaching. Keep your sermons moving and of reasonable length. Keep Jesus central to your preaching and preach the whole Bible, but connect it with real-life issues. Millenials do not want the word of God compromised. Leave room for the different views of people on subjects not clearly revealed in scripture. Don't be narrow or closed-minded.

"7: **Purpose**: Emphasize why your church exists and speak often of your passion and purpose for the commission of Jesus to make disciples of all nations. They are looking for purpose in their live, and are not materialistic like previous generations. They care more about purpose than prosperity. They care more about the why of ministry than the what of ministry. Don't just advertize your programs; stress the purpose of those programs and how they help people reach their full potential."

Dr Daniel Crescenzo PhD was the first speaker.

"The word 'stereotype comes from the Greek

words 'stereos,' meaning hard, firm, or solid, and 'typos,' meaning a figure or model. The word was originally coined in the late 1700s to refer to a duplicated printing plate. In the 1920s the word began to take on the more psychological sense we are familiar with today. We are habituated into this thinking by friends, the media, and our experiences. We form conclusions about a particular group without looking for counter examples, or if we see counter examples, we say, 'That's an exception.' It is evil because of the hardness of heart involved. It comes out in our actions (from the abundance of the heart). Whatever keeps us from loving others a Jesus loves us has no place in our Christian lives."



Dr Betsy Weinrich PhD, second speaker

"Ex 20:4-6 instructs us, 'You shall not make for yourselves a carved image, or any likeness of anything... ... you shall not bow down to them or serve them...'We are to worship God in spirit and in truth. But we still worship idols because we want to have control over the thing we worship. You can't have a relationship with a graven image. Gen 1:26-27 says we are made in the image of God, so our real self is invisible. Stereotypes, however, are based on what is visible, like idols, premade images. Jesus condemned racial stereotypes with the story of the Good Samaritan, the hero of the story. The Samaritan woman was the first evangelist to the Samaritans because of Jesus.

"Being known for who we are, not for a stereotype, transforms us. Attempting to see people for who they are, rather than stereotypes, likewise transforms us.

"People like Pastor Heard are teaching me."



Sandra Goolsby, third speaker

"We serve a Jewish Jesus. We say the Jews killed him, but he said, 'No one takes my life; I give it freely.' How many Jews do we have in here? (almost everyone raised their hands.) Alright! That's right, we are grafted in. In Rom 11, Paul tells us the Jews rejected Jesus, s we got the opportunity. We must be about our Father's business. The Jews did only what the Father willed. What is our challenge here? We must bring in the harvest.

"It is a myth that all undocumented aliens come from Mexico. This is a stereotype. We, as the body, must lead the way."

All the people broke up into smaller groups of 7 or 8 and went to discuss. This reporter was with a group that had Pastor Theotis Johnson as facilitator.

Pastor Theotis: How do we believe God views stereotypes?

Greg Brockman: I feel like he does not want us to be a type of person, but just have a relationship with his – have some spontaneity. Cheryl: He struggles with it a great deal. Where

did it start? In the garden.

Theotis: In the garden? Where was the first conflict? It started in heaven with Satan.
