On Prayer 64 Praying for Your City (Part Five)

Ps 22:3 says that God inhabits the praises of his people. If you have ever studied that verse, you know that the New American Standard Bible rightly translates the Greek: God is "enthroned upon the praises of his people." We can enthrone God over our municipalities if God inhabits and is enthroned on our praises. Every home group can cause God to inhabit their area of a city through intercession and worship.

I love my city because God has called me here. People make fun of it, but I would rather live here than anywhere else. The bread basket of the world, it is full of beautiful rolling hills. Also, the people are beautiful. Don't let anyone run down your city or state.

There are seven practical steps to cultivating a love for your city.

- 1: **Develop roots**. That means invest in your city. Invest service, invest time, maybe even run for office.
- 2: Study the history of your city. If you can discover your city's history, you can find out what needs to be bound. Then you must ask to see if it is bound in heaven and listen for the answer; don't just bind without asking God, and then expect it to be bound. Was the city started with greed? Who lives in your city? What characterizes your city? Each area of your city has a different principality. We need to study the history of our suburbs also.
- 3: **Take a tour.** The principle found in Psalm 48:12-13 is good advice for us: "Walk about Tzion, and go around her; count her towers; consider her ramparts; go through her palaces; that you may tell it to the next generation."
- 4: **Look at everything.** Open your eyes. We need to look at fountains, boulevards, parks, children, schools, flowers, and trees. What does this have to do with prayer? Open your eyes and analyze.
- 5: **Have compassion on the poor.** We need to have pity on and bless the slum areas and the disenfranchised areas of your city. As you read this, you may be <u>one</u> of the poor, the disenfranchised, you may **live** in one of the slum areas. If so, you will be able relate.
- 6: **Evangelize your neighborhood**. Bless your neighborhood. You cannot even consider your city without thinking about winning souls.
- 7: Love and pray for your city. Jim Croft in Ft Lauderdale, is big on praying for cities. He had a bumper sticker made up: "We love and pray for Ft Lauderdale." But whether the idea is placed on a bumper sticker or not, it should be written on our hearts. "We love and pray for this city."

This message is the word of the Lord to every believer: He is going to loose prayer for our cities. We can change the spiritual atmosphere of our cities and our country.

I believe that from now on when you pray, you will not think only of the president and national or international crises, such as Syria, Central America, and the Supreme Court. You will be thinking of your own downtown sectors and your suburbs – or wherever you have been placed by God. If this can become part of your prayer life, you change the spirit of your area and release revival.

I am excited because I think this is charting new territory for many. Will you start placing your city in your prayers?

"Well, it wouldn't have been so humorous if that little coyote was actually a full-grown coyote, and had come into your back yard garden and attacked ole Pookie here, would it?"

Both men were quiet for a few moments. "I suppose you're right," Henry admitted. "So you're saving that the little coyote represents evil?"

"Essentially, yes. That coyote represents an omen of the evil that exists in this world due to the original sin of Adam and Eve. I Peter 5:8 says, 'Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour.'

"I thought you said your example was a coyote."

Jerry shook his head. "Very cute. I think you can see where I'm going with this. Lions – coyotes – whatever. The devil and his minions will do everything they can to devour you. Unfortunately,

- they constantly patrol the fence around each person's garden, so they must be chased off."

"Why is that so important?" Henry challenged. "Can't you just ignore evil? If you leave it alone, chances are, it probably won't jump the fence into your garden."

"The big picture answer is that if you don't acknowledge the presence and resulting danger regarding the origin of evil, you'll have a hard time seeing the need for God. And that, my friend, is one of the reasons why Satan roams around, trying to corrupt people. Satan is an accuser and a deceiver. However, he and his demons aren't responsible for all evil."

"What do you mean?"

"Demons – or evil spirits – mostly just fan the sinful flames of humans in the hopes people will rebel against God and his commands."

"Then why doesn't God halt all evil right now? If God is indeed real, he certainly has the power to do that."

"I'm getting to that," Jerry said. "Please bear with me. God has actually given you an effective fence to protect your garden – the Bible. But even with it, evil can still jump into your garden."

"Why?"

"The reason can be found in Gen 3:17, which is where God cursed the earth due to mankind's sin. So yes, God has the power to do anything. However, due to the nature of this fallen, cursed world – which is cursed due to sin – God currently allows the presence of evil."

"That doesn't sound so good."

"Don't fret. There's some real good news on this front. But alas, we won't be getting into that until next month."

"Whoa! Did you just give me a preview of February's lesson?"

"Never mind," Jerry said, grinning. "Anyway, evil actually originated with Satan's rebellion against God a long time ago. An example of this is reflected in Ezekiel 28:17, "Your heart became proud on account of your beauty, and you corrupted your wisdom because your splendor. So I threw

you to the earth; I made a spectacle of you before kings."

"Why did God give Satan the heave-ho from heaven?"

"Because Lucifer – the angel's name at the time – wanted to be worshiped, just like God. Ultimately, his pride got him banished from God's holy mountain. After that, he became known as Satan – a fallen angel."

"I see. So you are saying that Satan later corrupted mankind in the Garden of Eden, just like we talked about?"

"That's correct. That's also the reason why the first part of this program starts with evil and why it exists, also, why God allows it. Before we proceed any further, you need to first understand that there are dangerous influences inside and outside your garden that can devour you; that is, if you aren't careful."

"So the potentially ravenous animals in the wooded green space behind my garden represent the presence of evil? Is that what you're saying?"

"Figuratively, yes," Jerry said. "There are actually two facets to evil: number one, evil is external, like the evil forces we just compared to your green space. The primary objective of these external, demonic forces is to influence you toward sin. Number two, evil is internal, which is the innate human tendency toward sin. People can guard themselves against both facets of evil by following God's handy survival guide – the Bible. In this analogy, of course, the Bible is represented by the fence around your back yard."

"I see," Henry said. "Even though evil can come at me from different directions, I can still fight it with God's survival guide, the Bible?

"That's correct."

"I'm not quite buying this," Henry said. "I'm just trying to understand what you're saying. You know – with a open mind and all."

"I understand," Jerry said. "Anyway, the primary reason why you must understand the dangers of evil is that you fail to do so, you can fool yourself by indulging in self-reliance instead of depending on the Lord. When that happens, Satan wins. Of course, it goes without saying that you must belong to God's family to be able to tap into his power and live a righteous life."

"That's interesting. I can see where most people in the world would agree that evil truly exists. It's really foolish to deny it. But I can also see how the Christian perspective has a reasonable answer to the origin and presence of evil; not to mention the consequences of it."

"Henry my friend," Jerry began, "God made this incredibly intricate world right before he made mankind in his image. Since Satan fell into sin, and later corrupted mankind as well, the evil one has been trying to re-make this world in his own, selfish, self-centered, sinful image. Unfortunately, Satan's evil efforts continue up to this very moment."

"That sounds pretty depressing."

"I hear you, but it's really not. Anyway, in this segment, my warning to you is that earth is currently a place of both good and evil; a world which has both sin and the resulting presence of death. To be honest, I think God probably looks at Earth like it's a death-infested sewer – at least as it is compared to his heavenly glory."

"Like is said – depressing," Henry mused.

"On the other hand, my encouragement to you is that through the person of Jesus Christ, God has provided you a way out of this sewer."

"You know," Henry began, "I've heard people who try to explain away evil as if it didn't exist – or, that evil is merely an illusion. However, those thought processes have never made much sense to me."

"Of course they don't!" Jerry retorted. "Using the comparison of this green space representing the

In other words, to the naturalists - those who generally don't acknowledge the supernatural - they have a difficult time explaining true evil. Therefore, logically speaking, moral relativism reigns supreme. Of course, this is basically a gigantic trap for those who espouse that kind of rubbish."

the body of Christ. It is this same sort of mindset that makes us want to make Jesus be like us. Many white people say he's white, but he is not. Many blacks say he is black, but he is not. When the Lord was here on earth, he was not a Baptist, nor an Anglican, not Methodist. In fact, he was not even a Christian; he was a Jew.

"People, we have to stop trying to make Jesus be like us and focus on becoming like him - wanting what he wants, working for what he did, weeping over what he wept over.

"What I have seen in the body of Christ, mostly among denominations, is never a preacher from one denomination preaching on the pulpit of another denomination - never, that is, until the Whole Body of Christ Alliance. What I have seen in the body of Christ, regardless of denomination, is a pessimistic paranoia that makes pastors act terrified that, if they allow someone to speak in their church who says something that they are not saying, God is going to get them. Pastors, Unity in the body is far more important to the Lord (see John 17) than some piece of misplaced doctrine.

In addition, your 'sheep' are not as stupid as you might think; if you disagree with a speaker's doctrine, just tell your people.

"I have seen this pessimistic Paranoia stand in the way of real unity time and time again. Think about it, Presbyterians: Do you really believe that Presbyterians are the only ones that will be in the kingdom of God? Baptists, do you think there is a Baptist section of heaven? AME Zion people, do you think the Lord is going to segregate the AME Zion folks over here and the Nazarenes over there, the Church of God in Christ on that block and the Fire Baptized Holiness on the next block?

The body of Christ has many pastors, or churches, or people that act as if they believe that they are the only ones who have the truth, and one on else does. If you believe that, whoever you are, you are deceived by the forces of darkness. If you are at a church that professes they have the truth and no one else does, be very wary, and do not drink the kool-aid.

"The truth of the matter is that no denomination, no church, no pastor, no one person has the whole truth, and we are not going to get it until we come together as the Lord prayed about in John 17. Folks, lets throw that pessimistic paranoia down right now before it becomes an appendage that can only be removed through surgery. I will repeat something I have already said: The Lord holds unity with each other far more important than anyone's pet doctrine. Yes, pastors, you will be held accountable, but it is far better to err on the side of working to achieve unity in love than erring on the side of isolating from the rest of the body because you are afraid someone is going to tell your people something you don't agree with, or because you or your denomination have the truth and no one else does.

I have heard some of the pastors who seem to espouse the pessimistic paranoia tell their people to "Come out from among them," speaking about others in the body of Christ that are not part of their church or denomination. They are quoting from Is 52:11 ('Go out from the midst of her'). The problem with this is that the word of God does not tell us to come out from among others in the body of Christ, but from the world.

"Most people don't fit into this extreme. So many are just indifferent.

"You do not have to be a pastor or elder, or apostle, prophet or evangelist. You don't have to be anything in particular, except a lover of God, to work to build his kingdom. All a person has to do is visit another church once a month or so. If you are part of a WBCA church, tell your pastor what you saw at the church you visited. Some one will take it from there. There now, was that difficult? Stay with us, folks. We will not stop building the kingdom of

"I wanna talk about a woman because God came to save sinners. Luke 7:37, many people think the Bible says she was a harlot, but this is not true; it says she was a sinner. This woman was looking for Jesus. She went into the house where she was not wanted. Shim'on was a P'rush (Pharisee). They were in his house. "Yeshua's feet had not been washed, but the woman's tears washed them. The P'rushim (Pharisees), of which Shim'on (Simon) the Leper was one (Shim'on was the one Yeshua had healed of leprosy), began to think that, if Yeshua was any kind of prophet, he would know that the woman was a sinner. Simon began to act just like church folks. I've never seen people like church folks. He had animosity in his heart, and he looked down on this woman (she was Miryam sister of Marta & El Azar – see John 11). Shim'on looked down on her. What if Jesus would've looked down on us?

"I used to smoke and sell marijuana, but when Jesus looked down <u>at</u> me (not <u>on</u> me), he took me, picked me up, dusted me off, and though I was worth saving. He gave me a new heart. When he changed me, I looked at my hands and my feet because the word says, 'How beautiful are the feet...' But He does not change you from the outside in; but the inside out (my hands and feet did not look different).

"I want you to know Jesus has come here in victory. Nothing would ever have happened for this woman until she became ready to change.

"She came uninvited where she knew she was not wanted. She made up her mind. Why? Because Jesus was in the house. Simon did not know him and half the church would not know him either. Jesus told Simon, 'You did not wash my feet, anoint my head, not kiss me. This woman you look down on has done all of these things to me.' I heard a long time ago that this woman was the church and that the church was this woman. Point at me and say, 'Yes, I did those things, but they are behind me.' God is looking for people who have made up their mind that they are gonna live for Jesus.

yourself, chill out, and meditate on him. The second part of the Ten Commandments clearly says to rest.

White gloved, Dr Mary Neal passed out matza to the attendees. This was brought by the sages and the rabbis to the table during Pesach (Passover). Echad is one broken into three matza, or threecalled-one. Some rabbis said it is for Avraham, Yitzchak (Isaac), and Ya'akov (Jacob) (Old Testament) or Father, Son, Holy Spirit. Traditionally, they take out the middle piece and it is wrapped in white linen, it is then buried until the end of the meal. At the end, the children are typically sent out to find it and dig it up. It is brought back unwrapped, broken, then eaten as a family or community in 'remembrance of me.' "People say, 'I sinned today.' Well you can't get clean if you don't get in the water. You gotta get the sin out. We are taking this communion, as the body of Christ." says Dr Mary Neal.

On Sunday mornings there are preferences – music, clothing, lighting – it doesn't matter. We all belong to the right church even though we go to separate places. There is nothing in scripture that says we all have to go to the same place. All our life experiences were for God's glory. Jesus said, 'Y'all go teach all nations.' He didn't tell them where to go to church.

"Unity in the body of Christ: we need a church in Banks County. Sometimes we forget things. Jesus broke bread and fed thousands, he walked on water. That's cool stuff, but he came to seek and save the lost.

"We need to agree on the reach of sin. Nobody is exempt. None of us is gonna get there but through Christ. The effects of sin are that it will take you further and cost you more than you expected. The wages of sin is death we know this and only two men in the Bible did not die – Elijah and Enoch. If you are breathing tonight, you are a candidate for salvation. We have to tell them – we, the body of Christ. We have to put all out differences aside, come together, and go after the lost. It doesn't matter what music we worship to, we have to begin making a difference in the city of Commerce, Jackson County, Banks County, the state of Georgia. Can we do it? Twelve disciples changed

the world. We can all do it.

Mary Tate

Mary Tate shared how God brought her through many things. She was a minister's daughter, always in church, being taught the word of God. At age eighteen she got married and had children. Her husband was a drug addict for thirty one years. Her faith is what brought her through all those trials, having been taught how to pray and to trust God. At age 46, she hydroplaned and hit an eighteen wheeler. Her life came to a screeching halt. She lay in the bed from September to February with a

crushed left leg, all her ribs broken but three, fractured chest cavity, and cracked sternum. That was in 2005. She did not work for two years and went to a mental hospital. She was discharged on Christmas Eve recovered from the physical trauma. In 2009, her husband met her at the front door and asked her for a divorce. She went through her divorce in 2009, lost her job in 2010, moved out of her house because she had lost her job the same year. She had no car, and had a nervous breakdown. She moved in with family. In February 2011, her house was auctioned off on the court house square. In March 2011, her ex husband (the father of her children) passed away from a drug overdose. She was so depressed. She felt like Job. She lived with family and friends and volunteered for a local shelter in town. She finally moved into the shelter.

Now she has her own transition home for single moms, which she opened in February 2015. The shelter was a teaching and training process. Ms Mary's House of Hope has been a blessing to so many single moms.



As some already know, the Battlefield News goes out to people who are incarcerated. Tony Davis is one of those. He has written some good articles for BFN in the past. Here is another:

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6

Who Jesus is to us is a life-or-death matter. We must believe rightly about Jesus; otherwise, he cannot be our Savior or our Lord. That's why Jesus put this question to his disciples in Mat 16:15, "But who do you say that

Some say that Jesus was a good man and even a prophet like Isaiah or Daniel. Others say that he was a son of God, but that God had many other sons. Still others say that he was like Moses. Mohammed and other religious leaders. But who do we say that Jesus is? We must believe that he is more than any of the descriptions above.

The Bible teaches that Jesus is one person of the triune Godhead, with the full essence and power of God. I John 5:7 says, "For there are three that bear witness in heaven: the Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one." In John 10:30, Jesus said something similar: "I and my Father are one."

Jesus existed from the very beginning.. The Bible says, "In the Beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1). John 1:14 says, "And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us." This is the miracle of the incarnation God in human flesh. Accordingly, the New Testament often refers to Jesus as both the Son of God and the Son of man. What does the incarnation mean to us? It means that where Jesus is, the Godhead is.

The abiding presence of Jesus through the Holy Spirit and his intercession and his intercession to the Father make it possible for us to live faithfully. I Cor 7:23 says, "You were bought at a price." Therefore, thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. In Luke 9:51 it says, "When the time had come for him to be received up, he steadfastly set his face to go to Jerusalem." When this occurred, he, in effect, declared that his death was the planned end of his mission. The rulers in Jerusalem believed that they had gotten rid of the blasphemer who was disrupting the people, but a Roman officer declared what he witnessed; the crucifixion of a righteous man.

The righteous Christ died on the cross outside Jerusalem to pay for human sins and to give new life to all who believe in him. All who are made right with God in Christ will live with him in the presence of God forever, in the new heaven and the new earth.

Those who condemned Jesus to be crucified had given false testimony against him. But the officer who witnessed Jesus' crucifixion, praised God when he declared Jesus a righteous man.

Our conviction about Jesus Christ determines the credibility and power of our Christianity.


