On Prayer 74 Intervention by Angels (Part Five)

When David defeated Goliath, he said, "I come against you in the name of the Lord of Hosts, the god of the armies of Israel, who you have defied" (I Sam 17:45). David knew the armies of God (angels) were on his side and had a revelation about angels, as well as angelic help in defeating goliath. Ps 34:7 says, "The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and he delivers them." The devil could not get to Job because God had a "hedge" of protection around him (Job 1:10). What was that hedge- shrubs? No, it was angels.

Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah are better known by their Babylonian names: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego. They were delivered from the fiery furnace by an angel. King Nebuchadnezzar said, 'Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego, who sent his angel and delivered his servant' (Dan 3:28).

Angels delivered Daniel from the lion's den. Daniel told King Darius, "My God sent his angel and shut the lions' mouths, so that they have not hurt me" (Dan 6:22).

We seem too often to overlook the fact that angels were involved in all these and other miracles.

Another interesting passage is found in Daniel chapter four. This is one of a very few places in the Bible where we see this reference – the Watchers, as Daniel calls them. The explanation about these particular angels is very lengthy and many passages would have to be cited. Therefore, this very brief explanation will be given with out proof.

God divided the earth into 71 areas with himself watching over Israel. Each area was assigned to a particular "watcher," called in other parts of scripture "sons of God."

"In the visions I saw while lying in my bed, I looked, and there was a watcher, a holy one, coming down from heaven. He cried aloud and said thus: 'Chop down the tree and cut off its branches, strip off its leaves and scatter its fruit... ...this decision is by the decree of the watchers, and the sentence by the word of the holy ones'" (Dan 4:13-17).

This is the passage that initially caused me to study the effect of angels on prayer. We usually think of god decreeing events. Here the angels are actively involved in the life of Nebuchadnezzar.

Angels are not independent of God. He is sovereign, and angels can only decree what the Lord instructs. Angels control events, decree events, and watch events that affect both kings and nations.

Angels were an essential part of the ministry of the early Church in the book of Acts. When Peter was in jail, an angel of God poked him in the side to wake him, opened the doors and released him (Acts 12:5-10). He had more trouble getting into the temple than out of jail. In Acts 5:18-20 an angel let the apostles out of prison as well.

In another account in Acts chapter 10, a centurion prayed to God daily. One day an angel came to answer his prayers. The angel said, "Your prayers and your alms have come up for a memorial before God." We see again that angels intervene directly in reference to people's prayers.

When the apostle Paul found himself in a storm on the Mediterranean Sea, he said,

"For there stood by me this night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve, saying, 'Do not be afraid, Pail; you must be brought before Caesar; and indeed God has granted you all those who sail with you" (Acts 27:23-24).

In answer to prayer, Paul received angelic deliverance.

The reason for the name of this article will not be immediately apparent to the reader, but stay with me and it will. There are words that we use as followers of Yeshua that we don't fully understand quite often and right here on the tail of this wonderful article by Jody Bennett seems quite a good place to dissect one of these words.

This word, "Faith," is one that seems to be greatly misunderstood. I have heard so many people -Christians and non-Christians - use the word "faith." It seems to mean different things to different people. Webster's New World Dictionary defines faith as: "An unquestioning belief that does not require proof or evidence," or " unquestioning belief in God, religious tenets, etc." It is easy to see, therefore, by the world's definition, why many Christians, themselves, misunderstand faith. I will not attempt to deal with faith from a worldly perspective. The world, believing itself to be more intelligent than God, is hopelessly confused about most things, and faith is no exception. I Cor 14:33 tells us that God is not the author of confusion.

According to Christian teachers, faith seems to be used in two different senses, on two different levels: on a primary or simpler level, and on a higher level – a level more difficult to understand. It is my intention to clarify what faith is on a primary level, not to deal with it, for now, on a higher level. It is faith on the primary level that we, as Christians, speak about the most. Unfortunately, it is faith on the primary level that many Christians seem to misunderstand. To help clear away some of that misunderstanding, let's take a look at what the Bible says about it, rather than what the world thinks about it, since it is what the world thinks about faith that has many misunderstanding what faith actually is.

Heb 11:6 tells us that "without faith it is impossible to please God because whoever comes to God must believe that God is and that he is a rewarder of those who diligently seek him." Is this a complicated faith - to believe that God is real? It may be to some. It is not difficult for Christians, however, or they would not be Christians. This brings us back to the primary sense of the word. In the primary sense, faith is simply belief - accepting or regarding as true the doctrines of Christianity. We must be able to believe that God is real, but this alone is not enough to make us Christians. Believing that God exists is not, in its self, a virtue. James 2:19 says, "The demons believe there is one God and tremble." Remember that Heb 11:6 says that we also believe that "he is a rewarder of those who diligently seek him." This refers to those put significant effort into knowing him better on an ongoing basis, not just believing he exists. It is those people that he rewards.

According to the worldly definition, faith is "an unquestioning belief that does not require... ...evidence. But what does the word of God tell us that faith is? Heb 11:1 gives the definition, but unfortunately, of the translations $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$ have seen, only the King James and the New King James have translated it true to the original Greek. The others I have seen only cloud it and make it more confusing.

Heb 11:1 says, "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." This definition tells us not only what faith is, but what faith is not. Faith is not believing without proof or evidence. Faith is **not** just believing in something so intensely that it becomes so. Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Substance! Evidence! The faith God wants is not blind faith, but faith based on the ability to see what he shows us - to not close our eyes to what is directly in front of us, those things that are so very obvious. In a sense, it is not allowing ourselves to be blind.

When our actions have wounded people, it's not funny. We have to apologize and seek forgiveness. But other times, before we have wounded anyone why not laugh at ourselves when we are shown those things that others see? Otherwise, we become just like the Pharisees.

There's a word for people that can't laugh at themselves and think that everything they do is right. It's not a very nice word that some people use to describe a certain farm animal. Not only have I been one at various times before I wised up, but I have also at times acted act like our Puritan ancestors, who almost never laughed and lived such humorless lives that someone described a Puritan as a person that was afraid that someone, somewhere was having a good time.

Here's my confession. I still have some Puritan blood running through my veins. That's the reason I've had to find some clowns in my life to hang around because I'm not one naturally. Many of the friends I made in college and seminary were people that made me laugh. I needed them. There were God's gifts to me. They helped me balance the serious with the comical.

Let's face it; this world is filled with a lot of serious stuff. Some people will not get serious about anything, and that's a problem. But most of us are affected by the serious issues of life in a way that threatens to take our joy away and leave us so turned inward on our problems that the world turns dark and gray. Even if someone like Bildad comes and tells us that our laughter will return, unless we are made to laugh, it's likely to mean little to us in times of suffering. But If we practice using humor daily and look for it everywhere we go, it will help us transcend suffering and difficult times when those times do come.

Perhaps some of you heard of the woman who went into the bedroom one morning and said, "Freddy, get up; it's time to go to school."

Freddy pulled the covers over his head and said, "I'm not going to school; the kids don't like me."

Fifteen minutes later she went back; he was still in bed. She said, "Freddy, get up; it's time to go to school." He pulled the covers over his head and said, "I'm not going to school; the teachers don't like me."

Fifteen minutes later she went back; he was still in bed. She said, "Freddy, get up; it's time to go to school!" He said, "I'm not going to school; the bus driver doesn't like me."

This time she screamed at him, "Freddy, you are fifty-three years old and the principal of that school; now get up and get going!"

Now haven't we all had days like that? We didn't want to get up and go to school or go to work because of something that we had to face that day that we were not looking forward to. Where is the joy in that?

We can all learn to see life from the perspective of Romans 8:28: "All things will work together for good for those that love God and are called according to his purpose." When we do, we can invite God into our space and expect joy to show up even in the midst of difficulty. When it does, when humor and laughter happen, we can rise above the pain, above tragedy, above suffering, above difficulty and transcend it. Sometimes it's only for a little while, but that little while is a gift from God

Think about it like this. When you are laughing, when you are immersed in laughter and joy, are you thinking about your pain? Do you think about your problems? Do you think about your suffering? Even if it's only for a few moments, humor allows you to transcend the difficulties of this world.

Victor Frankl lived through hell during his incarceration at Auschwitz. He attributed his ability to survive in spite of all of his suffering partly because of the humor which he and others maintained. What could you possibly find humorous in a concentration camp? One has to look hard, but humor is around us everywhere if we look. When we see it, it is "another of the soul's weapons in the fight for self-preservation."

Frankl wrote, "It is well known that humor, more than anything else in the human makeup, can afford an aloofness and an ability to rise above any situation, even if only for a few seconds.

The woman that taught me makeup back in the day when clowning was in vogue was Daisy Rademaker. Daisy trained some clowns that went on to clown for Barnum and Baily Circus. Daisy wore a hat with her clown costume filled with yellow daisies. During the Pegasus Parade before the Kentucky Derby in Louisville, Kentucky, Daisy always walked behind the horses that were in the parade. Whenever the horses did their business in the middle of the parade route, which they usually did somewhere along the way, Daisy ran to the pile of fresh manure and placed single daisy right in the middle of the pile. I can tell you from experience and from walking with hundreds of people through all kinds of problems in life, this world isn't just going to just rain on your parade; this world is going to plop some manure on it somewhere along the way. How are we going to respond? Daisy's message to the crowd along the parade route was that you can respond to the mess like this: plant a

daisy in it. Christians can be those people that stick a daisy in that pile. We can be those people that look for comedic perspective in the midst of the pain. This is not about denial. When you take medicine, you are not denying that you are sick. You are acknowledging that you are not well but that you need some medication to help make you better.

Used in the right way, good humor it is the medicine that God has given to us to heal. Paul never denied that he was suffering, but in the midst of his suffering, he let everyone know that Jesus was the one that helped him maintain his joy. The comedic perspective is given to us by the Holy Spirit to see things as God sees them. That doesn't mean things are always funny. It does mean that this world should not be able to take away our joy. So yes, that means that we will laugh when others will not or cannot. We need holy laughter, unspoiled by sin, to remind us that God is the one that helps us rise above all things unholy, unfulfilling, and un-Christ-like so that we might live the abundant life Jesus promised we could live.

"Twenty seven years ago I was an alcoholic drug addict. I went into the navy, but it was still a struggle. One News Years Eve my father said, 'Let's go to church.' I opened my mouth to say no, but yes came out.

"Somebody put an old worthless goat in a hole and began throwing dirt on him to bury him, but he would just shake off the dirt. They kept throwing dirt on him and he kept shaking it off. After a while there was enough dirt thrown into the hole that the goat just stepped out of it. Tonight is the night to shake it off. Step out of that hole

"I told God, 'If there is anything you can do wit this (me), I give it to you right now.' He saved me. I had a brand new high — a spiritual high with no hangover. You get drunk and you say you'll never do it again, but when you get in the Holy Ghost, you can't wait to do it again.

"God will allow that sea to part, whatever that sea is, so you can cross on dry land. God is fruitful and he is looking for fruitful people. When Israel came out of Egypt, they came out with spoils. We are excited about what god is doing. The smallest measure of matter is invisible. It's not the crack cocaine that changes someone; it is the Spirit. You are spirit, so the devil is after your spirit."

"If you don't praise your way out of situations, even when you don't feel like it, you are not sacrificing.

"Heb 4:13, nothing is hidden that will not be revealed. V_{14-15} , Jesus has been where you are. He has been there and yet without failing, without sin. Satan could tempt the skin Jesus was in, but not his divinity.

"Heb 4:16, when you find yourself in a hard place, let us draw near to the thrown of grace that we may receive mercy. We have an advocate with the Father if we are tempted. We can stand up under it because we are seated with him in heavenly places."

"What makes us one in Christ?

1: Christ himself. If any marriage is based on Christ, it will succeed no matter how diverse the people are. It is he who knows us, put us together, and is determined to keep us together. No Christian marriage ends in divorce unless one or both of the people have walked away from Jesus. He is married to the church. You are the bride of Christ, therefore, everything you do should bring glory to his name.

"I was in the US Army, but I had shin splints. So I had to rest a month in basic training. This made me a recycle, which means I had to start all over again. I had to qualify – to shoot, but this bushman from Ghana had not seen anything like this before, so I failed to qualify with this weapon. I was recycled again. In Basic training I was writing to my wife, telling her how much I loved her, I said, 'as Christ loved the church.' The Holy Spirit said to me, 'Do you know how Christ loved the church?' He bent over and washed the feet of those he loved. He insured that the interest of his love's interest came first, even to death.

"I told my wife, 'I give you an emotional debit card and anytime you feel I'm wrong, swipe it. Even if you kill me, with my last breath, I forgive and say I love you.' Church, whatever anyone has done to you, love and forgive.

"2: The second building block is trust. God brought Khawvah (Eve) to Adam, who said '...bone of my bone...' They were naked and were not ashamed. We lose when we do not open to one another. I do not like surprises. We come into a marriage and say, 'Can I trust this man – this woman?' No! Say, 'I will be trustworthy.' I give people who say, 'Trust me,' three times. The third time they tell me to trust them, I'm gone. I have never been

anywhere that my wife did not know where I was. Even when I have to stay late at work, I call her to let her know. If I was with a woman so that, when I told my wife about it, I felt like I needed to edit that part out, I would never again be around that woman. We use our traditions to destroy the work of God. People say, 'If it's important, don't tell your wife.' No! Your job and your ministry will pass away, your kids will leave. The only thing that lasts until death is your spouse.

"3: Love. Let love be in the marriage. When our parents were married, love was not the main thing, but service: can she cook? Can she do her duty in the bedroom? A woman married for the reward — this man will build a house for me and my children. But in Christ, the reason is love.

"Look at your fiancée. Can you lover her as Christ loved the church? It is a problem that our standards are so that we don't even love the Lord; how can we love our spouse? There is a kind of love that does great things. There is love that is kind and performs acts of kindness. (see pg 8)

"Never say, 'That's just the way I am.' Saying I love you is good, but you must show it. You must also say it. If you have a hard time with it, practice in the mirror. Say it once and if you don't dies, say it again. Try it five times and, if you are still alive, keep going. Do the small acts of kindness. African women don't care about flowers. I know this. So if a man thinks about you all day and brings you flowers, don't throw them away; say, 'thank you,' and put them in water. Love is not always mighty, mighty things. It is also the small acts of kindness. Today I still open the door for my wife. Ask yourself, 'What little thing can I do for her?'

'4: the fourth building block is forgiveness. If you love me, you forgive me. No marriage will last without forgiveness. Be a pillar in that marriage. Any two people who live together - roommates, brothers, sisters, husband and wife - will offend each other. Offense will come, but when it does, you must forgive each other.

"Your ability to forgive is an indication of Christ in you. Before I am finished preaching today, I will offend someone. I love you. If you love me, you will forgive me. People get together and express the offense, but not the forgiveness. Christ paid a very high cost for this. I pray God open our eyes to acceptance - to know the way someone is, not the way you try to change them to be. No one is perfect. I give my wife a forgiveness debit card. Love is accepting someone for who they are, not for what you want them to be. Accept their faults, weaknesses, offenses. As you are accepting them, they are accepting you.

"If you love someone, you accept them; you do not love them for what you would make of them - their faults, weaknesses, offenses. As you are accepting them, they are accepting you.

"If you are removing the spec from your own eye, you will see that you are the offender. The reason Jesus died is so that God would accept you. So we must not allow the sins of each other to separate us. When you are counseling married people, you realize the things they are complaining about happened 15 years ago. I tell them I wanna know what happened yesterday. The Bible says god places your offenses as far as the east is from the west, throws them in the sea of forgetfulness. There is a reason that God created marriage as his first institution. The blessings of God are seeds of thought in a human. A seed has abilities such that one becomes many. To bless humans God needed that. Even when a virgin had Yeshua, he still needed a marriage to bring him here. God brings our spouse to us and it is the same thing. If you do not tell your spouse, you have lost 50% of the blessing.

"I know this couple and things have not always been rosy. Mama Karen: I can vouch for her, but for him? I don't know. If you can't forgive this man, God cannot bless you. Let us forgive one another that, as his bride, we will be able to rescue the souls he sends us. It is given to you that you be able to receive so that you can use these four building blocks. Then you marriage and relationship with God will flourish."

Jesus told 500 people and 120 of them did what he said and stayed in Jerusalem and gathered in an upper room praying. They did not know what was coming but they knew they were lacking. They knew something was coming so that they would no longer be lacking. They received power there and the same Man who denied Jesus a couple of months earlier, was able to address thousands. Thousands were saved that day. They received power because that prayer room was not empty. If there had been an empty room, there would not have been an empty tomb. We can talk unity, but we have to fill the prayer room. Pastors have 60 people in church, then call a prayer meeting and have six people show up. We must come into unity about filling the prayer room.



Mary Tate of Ms Mary's House of Hope spoke on Unity in the body of Christ

"This," Said Greg as he held up the Bible, "is the word – the written word, the logos. There are people who use it to slice other people. Rom 10:17 says that faith comes by hearing the **word** of God. When Jesus answered Satan during the temptation in Mat 4:4, he quoted from Deut 8:3, saying, 'Man does not live by bread alone, but by every **word** that proceeds out of the mouth of God.' In the original Greek the **word** is rhema (pron **hray** mah). It means the word that is **spoken** by God, not the written word. Praying and having God's presence

will bring the word to be **spoken** to us by him. We cannot have his presence with an empty prayer room. In Acts 2, they had the **visual** manifestation of his presence (sh'khinah) and in Acts 4, they called out for more. There are different levels of this. After chapter 4, Peter's shadow healed the sick.

"We all have the same mission and every person in this alliance has the authority given them by our Lord to build this alliance, to build the kingdom of God. Our mission is to <u>do the work</u> that is required to bring the body of Christ into <u>one real body.</u>

"If we really want revival, there is a process we must go through. If we **pray the price**, he will bring the awakening. Do we come for a good message or do we come for an encounter with God? It will change you in here. His presence will change you.

"I was crying out to the Lord the other day, saying, 'I want more of your Holy Spirit. I know I'm not worthy, but I want more.'

"He said, 'A son does not ask for bread because he is worthy; he asks because he is hungry.' He said, 'Warn my people that they are wearing the name "Christian" like a talisman.' He was saying that they are in it for what they can get. Our goal is supposed to be to glorify him – not our happiness, but his glory.

"Revival and judgment come together. There was that major revival in the late 1850s, then the Civil War. Azusa Street happened - major revival for a few years, then World War One. What happened with the Civil War? The Baptists, the Presbyterians and the Methodists all fought amongst themselves, mostly over the issue of slavery. Now we have the Northern Baptists and the Southern Baptists, The Presbyterian Church split for the first time (They have split since then as well), and the Methodist Church splintered into several churches and denominations. We are in that same place in this country right now. Blacks hate whites, who hate Blacks, Hispanics, and Orientals. There is far too much hate and resentment from the place where there should be none. The primary pro-slavery argument was that Africans were not human. Liberal pastors actually said this. So where are we today? There are black churches, white churches and Spanish churches - divided over the color of our skin. I am white, but more whites have done me wrong than anyone else.

Those women left there scarred, knowing in their hearts that they had been lied to.

"God wants to raise up men and women of God to stand up and tell the truth. We must, at the very least, pray for this nation. Also, we are not to hate on those girls who go through with this. They are our mission field. The world lied to them, hurt them and took their money because they were scared. We are not to stand with the lies of the devil. They have been hurt, wounded. We need to love on them. It is up to us to unite and cry out to the Father.

"If it can happen in the theater, it should happen in church. I'm gonna call you down right now. In the theater grown men were weeping. Shouldn't there should be weeping in the body?"

"In Gen 11, nothing was impossible for them. Why? It was because their why was so strong... They had unity, but it was far from godly unity. God said, 'Let us go down there and confuse their language so they will not be able to understand each other. God did this, but it is the enemy that has done this same thing to us with our help. For us it is the Baptists, the Presbyterians, the Methodists, the Catholics, the Pentecostals and the like. Our language has been confused and we helped the devil do it. Christians continue to help him do it today, with the exception of the WBCA and alliances like it. We have different languages. What do we need to do?

"We cannot have unity without holiness. It is impossible because we cannot allow sin to become part of this unity or we will be like those in Gen 11. 'The Fire Baptized Holiness Church was black and white in the beginning. Thousands of churches were birthed. Then the founder died and his son took the reigns and did it his way. God had to come tear it down. Now there are only about a hundred churches. We need to increase that number to what it once was

"We have to have holiness in it. There are churches out there that say they really want to be part of this because we don't stop. I have seen alliances much bigger, but none of them lasted longer than three years. This one has been going for almost nine. We cannot allow the spirit of Babel (Baw-bell, not Babble) to be in us.

"Joel 2:1, 'Blow the shofar in Tzion; sound the alarm..." When Bishop James said this, Rabbi Rick blew the shofar. "These evil things? Why? It

is because we wanna do our own thing.

"Joel 2:14-15, 'Declare a holy fast.' We wanna do it our way, but it's God's way or no way. Everything you see here happened before. The devil uses the same old tricks. He has no fancy

"At Gethsemane we have been seeing revival. We just prayed and pow! If we pray, God will move. People were taking pictures of people with fire on their head and fire all over the tent.

"I used to wrestle and play football. If you get injured, you keep pounding. That is what you gotta do with the devil. You might limp, but your opponent is gonna die. This is a huge thing - the seven-day revival. If the only time you show up at it is when you are speaking, Houston, we have a problem!

"Joel 2:17, weep! Why – because we do not want to build this thing the wrong way. II Chron 7:14, if the sinners of the world? The crack dealers? No, 'My people.' Join together and the land will be healed. When you blow the shofar, it means that something is about to happen. V28-29, '...my spirit on all flesh." He will give you power and authority. Prophecy is not predicting the future, it is telling the mind of God. Prophecy is a creative power in you.

"Acts 2:1-3, 'When the day of Pentecost had come... ...began to speak in other tongues (and hear with other ears?)' Acts 1:7-8, he says you may not understand everything. Okay, go get some power. When we come together, we get power. When we come into one accord, we get power. He does the rest."

On into the night

Passover week continued to be a blessing under the tent at Gethsemane Fire Baptized Holiness Church in Gainesville, Georgia. Bishop Walker introduced the new addition to his congregation and to the Whole Body of Christ Alliance and said what a blessing it was to have a Jewish Rabbi. "Most of us," said Bishop Walker, "when we hear the word Jewish, will eliminate ourselves. We don't even know we are the people of God."

Another mighty testimony was given by Pastor Shawn Gray of the Church of Nazarene. "Eighteen years ago I was so sick. I was close to death. Thank God for a praying wife, Mother, and sister-in-law. They fasted and prayed and kept on fasting and praying. That's when a still, small voice said, 'This too shall pass.' I was so skinny and weak. My diet was toast, rice and water. One day I had enough energy to sit on the porch. The sun felt so good. Some folks I knew saw me and I led them to Christ right there. You see God uses every situation. The doctor said, 'He ain't gonna make it.' They had me ready for dead. God told me go to Jacksonville, Florida. I went. I obeyed. I went and

visited my cousin. While I was there, his friend showed up. It had been 15 years since I had seen him. These were praying men. After all of us were through praying, I heard the voice again, "I am healed," it said. Traveled back to Savannah and something came out of me unexplainable. It was black and silver. God got rid of it. At that time I was 97 pounds, but within a week, I was 120 pounds and I was gaining weight. As I stood on the scale in the doctor's office, I knew it. That's how good God really is.'

(from pg 1) the word of their testimony...' It is the holiday in which we apply the blood of our Messiah, Yeshua

(the Lamb of God) to the door posts and lintel of our hearts, and where we gather around to tell our personal exodus from Egypt, our sinful life before

"Literally, the word 'seder' (say-der) Hebrew means order. We use a booklet called a Haggadah ('the telling') to outline the order of service. A Haggadah is meant to give an order to the telling of our story of deliverance. The Passover Seder is a telling of deliverance and freedom, not just to edify the body, or unite a people in a common heritage, but more importantly, to instruct the next generations of what God has done and can do for them (Ex 12:26-27, 13:8). For this reason the Haggadah is kid-friendly since the involvement of children is a necessity. God is so highly invested in the next generation that he commands this retelling. The next generation must now of the God who has and can redeem (Ps 78). This element is so important to God that it is the only holiday that he not only allows a repeat, but mandates it for those unable to celebrate the first time. This repeat holiday is called Pesakh Sheni (shay-nee) or Second Passover (Num 9:6-13). It is so beautiful that our God built in a way of second chances

"Therefore the most important part of the Haggadah is this retelling of deliverance. In traditional Seder, every person should see themselves as id they were personally being redeemed fro Egypt. Beginning with our Patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, we recount our descent into Egypt and tell of the suffering and persecution we endured there. In this telling we are there as God sets forth his plan of redemption; as he sends the ten plagues to punish Pharaoh, his people and their gods; as Egypt and the known world see revealed the one true God of Israel. We witness the miraculous hand of God as the waters of the Sea of

Reeds (Red Sea) parts and we pass to freedom. We witness the military might of the Egyptian army fall to the military might of Adonai Tz'vaot (the Lord of Hosts).

"This is the story of the exodus from Egypt, but there is another story, one of personal redemption in the Messiah Yeshua (Jesus). We, who are in Messiah, also have a story of freedom. We have all witnessed the Z'roa Adonai, the arm of God, move on our behalf to deliver us from our own personal Egypt, and spiritual bondage, from a life of sin and death to everlasting life.

"Behold! The lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world,' John 1:29.

"There six elements," said Rabbi David Otero, "on a traditional Seder plate and three on the table. Among these is the kharoset, which represents the clay or mortar used with the bricks that the Israelites were forced to make under Pharaoh's taskmasters (Ex 1:14). The final element on the table is the set of four cups of wine or grape juice. This is because God uses four verbs to describe the Israelite redemption from Egypt (Ex 6:6-7). He says, 'I will **bring** you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians.' This is the cup of sanctification. He says, 'I will deliver (free) you from their

bondage.' This is the cup of judgment deliverance. Then he says, 'I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and mighty acts of judgment.' This is the cup of redemption/the new covenant. Finally, he says, 'I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God.' This is the cup of praise and completion.

'All women rise to bring in Pesakh," Rabbanit Kim continued. "As is the case every Shabbat evening, the woman of the house lights the Shabbat candles to welcome Shabbat into the home. As the candles are lit, we say this Messianic blessing: 'Barukh atah Adonai Eloheinu malech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu l'hiot or lagoyim v'natan lanu et Yeshua Mishikhenu haor laolam. Blessed are you, O Lord our God, king of the universe, who has sanctified us by your commandments, commanded us to be light to the nations and has given us Yeshua our Messiah the light of the world.

"In the drinking of the cups, we do not fill our own cup since once we were slaves, but now we are royalty, who do not fill their own cups. Traditionally, whoever fills your cup is the person vou will marry.



The children come to the front to ask the questions.

"The telling of the Maggid is in four parts. In part one, the youngest child is to read and sing the four questions.

"Part two is where the explanation of the four kinds of children or learners is read so that every parent will know how to instruct every type of child. This is also echoed by Rabbi Sha'ul (Paul the apostle), who said in I Cor 9:22, 'I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some.' The best instruction of Passover should not be standardized (this is the one-size-fits-all approach that the world tries to do with almost everything), but rather personal and intimate like one's testimony. We have all been each of these four children at some point. We have all been wise, wicked, simple, and clueless. We must, therefore, have the compassion and creativity of Messiah to reach every lost and misguided sheep. This brings me to the fifth child, the one not mentioned in the story. This child represents one who does not even care to be present at the Seder. We pray for them.

"Part three is the summary of the Exodus story. It begins with Avraham (Abraham) leaving his home in search of the promised land where he and his descendants could worship the Lord in peace. Then Joseph is sold into slavery, but exalted to second in command in Egypt. Next, it follows the enslavement of the Israelites by the Egyptians, who had forgotten the good deeds of Joseph. It continues with the deliverance of the Israelites from Egypt led by Moses, and it finishes at Mt Sinai, where the law is given and the people enter into covenant with God.

"Part four is the part of the summary that ends with the four main elements of the Passover Seder.

"The four questions are as follows:

- 1: On all other nights we may eat leavened or unleavened bread; but on this night why only unleavened bread?
- 2: On all other nights we eat vegetables of any kind; but on this night why must we eat bitter herbs?
- 3: On all other nights we do not dip our vegetables even once; but on this night why do we dip twice?
- 4: On all other nights we eat our meals sitting or reclining; but on this night why do we eat reclining?
- "At one time the fourth question was, 'Why do we eat only roasted lamb on Passover?' This was changed, however, after the destruction of the temple in 70 AD because there were no sacrifices in the temple and no lamb was eaten.
- "At this point the Seder plate is returned to the table and the matzah is uncovered as the reply to the questions.
- "Four times the Torah declares that a father should tell his sons the story of Pesakh. Therefore, the rabbis infer that there are four types of children.



The different children read the questions asked by the four sons.

"The wise son asks, 'What is the meaning of the customs, decrees and laws which God has commanded us?' (Deut 6:20). Tell him the laws of Passover to the last detail.

"The wicked son asks, 'What does this ritual mean to you?' (Ex12:26). By using this expression 'to you' he excludes himself from his people and denies God. Shake his arrogance and reply strongly, 'It is because of what the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt.' (Ex 13:8). 'For me,' but not 'for him,' for if he had been in Egypt, he would not have been redeemed.

"The simple son asks, 'What does this mean?' Tell him, 'With a mighty hand, the Lord brought us out of Egypt, out of bondage.' (Ex 13:14).

"As for the son who doesn't even know how to ask, you must begin for him. As it is written in the Torah, 'You shall tell your child on that day: I do this because of the wonders the Lord did for me, when I came out of Egypt.' Thus one must arouse an interest in what the Lord has, can, and will do.

"If you so choose, begin the prayer for the fifth son, the one not present due to unbelief. May he be taught by the Lord and present at the next Passover Seder.

"There are 70 seats in here today because there were 70 people that came with Israel (Jacob) to Egypt. During Passover, no leavened bread is to be in the house anywhere. Pesakh is to observed on the 14th day of the tenth month.

At this point, the Exodus summary begins with Abraham, the first Hebrew. God called Abraham from his nation, from his family, and from the idols of his fathers. As a reward for his faithfulness and obedience, God promised to make Abraham a great nation.

God gave Abraham a son miraculously conceived in his old age. His name was Yitzchak (Isaac). Isaac served the God of Abraham and had two sons, Jacob and Esau. Jacob was fruitful and had 12 sons of his own. One son was Joseph, who had a special gift for interpreting dreams. Out of jealousy, his brothers sold him into slavery in Egypt. The pharaoh of Egypt had a dream that no one could interpret, so Joseph was asked. Joseph's interpretation so impressed Pharaoh that he made Joseph the second most powerful man in Egypt. Because of Joseph's influence in Egypt, his father and all the kids (70 in all) were allowed to dwell in the fertile plains of Goshen.

At first the Israelites were 70, but they became a mighty nation. There came a new Pharaoh, who did not know Joseph. He feared the sons of Jacob. So he subdued Israel, and afflicted them with cruel labor – to build Pharaoh's supply cities of Pithom

and Raamses. This fulfilled the prophecy God gave Abraham in Gen 15:13-14.

In spite of the oppression, the Hebrews continued to flourish. Therefore, out of fear, Pharaoh ordered every male child to be cast into the Nile (Ex 1:22).

A Hebrew woman named Yokheved refused to obey Pharaoh's command and she placed her son into a basket and floated him down the Nile. His name was Moshe (Moses) and he was found in the river by Pharaoh's daughter and raised as Egyptian royalty.

That king of Egypt died and Moshe ran off into the land of the Midianites (Ethiopia) to escape prosecution for the murder of am Egyptian taskmaster. He married Zipporah, and Ethiopian woman (Yes, Hebrew Moses married a black woman). God remembered his covenant with Abraham. All this with Moshe was part of God's plan to use Moshe to rescue his people. He sent Moshe to tell Pharaoh, 'Let my people go that they may serve me" (Ex 8:1).

Pharaoh would not listen to the God of Israel, so Moses pronounced judgment on Pharaoh's house, the land, and upon the gods of Egypt. Nine plagues were inflicted upon them, upon their crops, and upon their flocks. But each time Pharaoh's heart was hardened. He refused to yield to the will of God.

Then the tenth plague fell upon the land of Egypt: the death of the firstborn. "That you may know that the Lord does make a distinction between the Egyptians and the Israelites.....against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am the Lord" (Ex 11:7, 12:12). "Now the blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you are. When I see the blood, I will pass over you; and the plague shall not be on you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt" (Ex12:13)

God had commanded the heads of each household to sacrifice a spotless lamb and apply its blood to the doorposts and lintel of their houses. It was by the blood of the lamb that the Hebrews were spared God's wrath and judgment. (sound familiar?) So strong was the cry in Egypt that Pharaoh finally let the Hebrews go and they exited Egypt with the mixed multitude who had seen the might and power of God. Together they were led through the Sea of Reeds. At Mt Sinai the long-awaited marriage covenant was signed, the covenant of the Torah of Truth.

This is the end of the traditional Exodus story, but there is another story, an even greater exodus – an exodus from spiritual Egypt. It is through our bondage to sin that death has entered our world. Is is only through the restorative work of our Messiah Yeshua, and his blood that we put on the doorposts and lintels of our hearts, that life can be restored.

"After the Tehillim (Ps 113 & 114) is read," said Rabbanit Kim Otero, "we lift up the second cup of wine – the cup of judgment and deliverance – and say the b'rakhah. Then we recline to the left and drink the cup of deliverance.

"The three matzahs, are placed in a matzah tosh and the middle piece is broken. Why? As Messianic believers, we understand the riddle of the three matzahs to symbolize God, the Messiah and humankind. As we break the middle matzah in two, we are acknowledging that it is Messiah who is the mediator between God and man. The larger piece of the matzah is wrapped and hidden. This is the afikoman and once it is recovered, it will be the last thing eaten at the Seder. Afikoman id Greek and it means 'that which comes after' or dessert.

"The Seder cannot be completed until the afikoman is found, ransomed and eaten. The smaller piece is eaten before the meal."

The afikoman had ben hidden earlier and seven-year-old Alexa Collins found it. Rabbi David offered her \$5.00 for it, but she refused. \$10.00? No! \$20.00? No! \$30.00? No! Alexa finally settled for \$40.00.

"The afikoman," continued Kim Otero, "is then to be broken and eaten by all. Breaking it apart, the leader distributes a piece of the afikoman to each person. It is the last thing eaten, the pinnacle of the meal

"As Messianic believers, the afikoman is symbolic of Yeshua. He was broken for us, wrapped in a

cloth just like the matzah tosh (grave cloth), resurrected (a ransom for our sin), and whoever finds him, finds a great reward. At 'The last supper,' it was the afikoman Yeshua broke and passed to his friends saying, 'This is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me' (Luke 22:19).

"In this case grace is said **after** the meal. This is called the Bir'khat Hamazon. It is a four part prayer. The first blessing is for nourishment, the second for the land, the third blessing is for Jerusalem and the fourth for God's goodness.

"This b'rakhah having been said, we come to the cup of redemption. It was this cup that Luke 22:20 records, 'Likewise he took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is shed for you." This cup represents the blood that Messiah shed for us. I Cor 11:25 says, 'This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

"John 19:34 tells us, 'One of the soldiers pierced hi side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.' We add three drops of water to our wine to symbolize the true makeup of Messiah's blood, which fills us to overflowing. As Messianic believers, we recall our Messiah's death on the tree and how blood and water came out.

"Lift the third cup of wine, say the b'rakhah, recline to the left and drink the cup of redemption. "Pour the fourth cup for everyone and Elijah. In Jewish tradition, the prophet Elijah will herald the

"At this point the door is opened, Elijah is welcomed and we quote from Ps79:6-7. As Messianic believers, we know that Elijah has already come because Messiah has already come

(Mat 11:10-15 & Mark 9:11-13). "In Matthew 26:27 20 Vachus in

coming of messiah (Mal 4:5-6).

"In Matthew 26:27-29, Yeshua, is speaking to his talmidim (disciples): 'He took the cup and gave it to them saying, "Drink from it, all of you..." This is in reference to the third cup, the cup of redemption mentioned earlier. He continued, 'I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until the day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.' He is speaking of the fourth cup, the cup of praise.

"Before we continue, we must ask a very important question: Why doesn't Yeshua drink the third and fourth cups? Remember the third cup is the cup of redemption. Yeshua, being the spotless lamb does not need to be redeemed, but instead chose to be sacrificed for our redemption. "Because there are so many who are still to be redeemed, Yeshua does not drink from the cup of praise also. Yeshua cannot fully rejoice until all Israel is saved (Rom 11:25-27). He will drink that final cup in the kingdom at the marriage supper of the lamb, where we will once again be united with our bride groom in purity and truth.

"He drank the first cup, the cup of sanctification, no problem. The second cup was the cup of judgment. He asked the Father if there was any other way, but there was not. So he drank the cup of judgment on our behalf. Only he could take our place.

"Messiah had to be **sanctified** in order to take upon himself our yoke of **judgment**, to be the **redemption** of our souls that we might render **praise** to the one who is worthy.

"We praise him and thank him for all that he is. Then we lift up the fourth cup, say the b'rkhah, recline to the left and drink the cup of praise.

"Passover is one of three pilgrimage feasts where God commands that we go to Jerusalem. For those not present in Jerusalem, the last line of the Seder is recited, 'L'shana haba-ah birushalayim!' Next year in Jerusalem!"


